That § 18.2-186.3 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 18.2-186.3. Identity theft; penalty; restitution; victim assistance. 11 A. It shall be unlawful for any person, without the authorization or permission of the person or 12 persons who are the subjects of the identifying information, with the intent to defraud, for his own use 13 or the use of a third person, to: 14 15 1. Obtain, record or access identifying information which is not available to the general public that 16 would assist in accessing financial resources, obtaining identification documents, or obtaining benefits of 17 such other person; 2. Obtain goods or services through the use of identifying information of such other person; 18 19 3. Obtain identification documents in such other person's name; or 20 4. Obtain, record or access identifying information while impersonating a law-enforcement officer or 21 an official of the government of the Commonwealth. B. It shall be unlawful for any person without the authorization or permission of the person who is 22 23 the subject of the identifying information, with the intent to sell or distribute the information to another 24 to: 25 1. Fraudulently obtain, record or access identifying information that is not available to the general 26 public that would assist in accessing financial resources, obtaining identification documents, or obtaining 27 benefits of such other person; 28 2. Obtain goods or services through the use of identifying information of such other person; 29 3. Obtain identification documents in such other person's name; or 30 4. Obtain, record or access identifying information while impersonating a law-enforcement officer or an official of the Commonwealth. 31 32 B1. It shall be unlawful for any person to use identification documents or identifying information of 33 another person or of a false or fictitious person, whether that person is dead or alive, to avoid summons, 34 arrest, prosecution or to impede a criminal investigation. C. As used in this section, "identifying information" shall include but not be limited to: (i) name; (ii) 35 36 date of birth; (iii) social security number; (iv) driver's license number; (v) bank account numbers; (vi) 37 credit or debit card numbers; (vii) personal identification numbers (PIN); (viii) electronic identification 38 codes; (ix) automated or electronic signatures; (x) biometric data; (xi) fingerprints; (xii) passwords; or 39 (xiii) any other numbers or information that can be used to access a person's financial resources, obtain 40 identification, act as identification, or obtain goods or services. 41 D. Violations of this section shall be punishable as a Class 1 misdemeanor. Any violation resulting in financial loss of greater than \$200 shall be punishable as a Class 6 felony. Any second or subsequent 42 conviction shall be punishable as a Class 6 felony. Any violation resulting in the arrest and detention of 43 44 the person whose identification documents or identifying information were used to avoid summons, 45 arrest, prosecution, or to impede a criminal investigation shall be punishable as a Class 6 felony. In any 46 proceeding brought pursuant to this section, the crime shall be considered to have been committed in 47 any locality where the person whose identifying information was appropriated resides, or in which any part of the offense took place, regardless of whether the defendant was ever actually in such locality. 48 49 Any person who in violation of this section appropriates the identifying information of 10 or more persons is guilty of a Class 3 felony. Any person who in violation of this section appropriates the 50 51 identifying information of 100 or more persons is guilty of a Class 2 felony. 52 E. Upon conviction, in addition to any other punishment, a person found guilty of this offense shall 53 be ordered by the court to make restitution as the court deems appropriate to any person whose identifying information was appropriated or to the estate of such person. Such restitution may include 54 55 the person's or his estate's actual expenses associated with correcting inaccuracies or errors in his credit report or other identifying information. 56 57
