069218844 1 **SENATE BILL NO. 324** 2 3 4 5 6 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE (Proposed by the Senate Committee on Finance on February 8, 2006) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Whipple) A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 22.1-289.1 and 22.1-295 of the Code of Virginia, relating to teacher 7 quality. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 9 1. That §§ 22.1-289.1 and 22.1-295 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 22.1-289.1. Teacher compensation; biennial review required. It is a goal of the Commonwealth that its public school teachers be compensated at a rate that is 11 12 competitive in order to attract and keep competent excellent teachers. The Director of Human Resource Management shall conduct a biennial review of the compensation of teachers and other occupations 13 requiring similar education and training and shall consider the Commonwealth's compensation for 14 15 teachers relative to member states in the Southern Regional Education Board. The results of these 16 reviews shall be reported to the Governor, the General Assembly and the Board of Education by June 1 17 of each odd-numbered year beginning with 1989. However, a preliminary report shall be submitted by 18 the Director of Human Resource Management by December 15, 1987. 19 § 22.1-295. Employment of teachers. 20 A. The teachers in the public schools of a school division shall be employed and placed in 21 appropriate schools by the school board upon recommendation of the division superintendent. In placing 22 teachers, school boards shall fill positions with licensed instructional personnel qualified in the relevant 23 subject areas. 24 B. School boards shall, in accordance with guidelines established by the Board of Education, adopt 25 employment policies and practices designed to promote the employment and retention of the highest quality instructional personnel and to effectively serve the educational needs of students. Such policies 26 27 shall include, but need not be limited to, incentives for excellence in teaching, including financial support for teachers attending professional development seminars or those seeking and obtaining national 28 29 certification. School boards shall develop a procedure for use by division superintendents and principals 30 in evaluating instructional personnel that is appropriate to the tasks performed and addresses, among other things, student academic progress and the skills and knowledge of instructional personnel, 31 32 including, but not limited to, instructional methodology, classroom management, and subject matter 33 knowledge. Each teacher with continuing contract status shall be evaluated not less than once every 34 three years. A teacher with continuing contract status who has an unsatisfactory evaluation shall be 35 evaluated the following year. Such evaluations of instructional personnel shall be maintained in the employee's personnel file. Copies of the evaluations shall be made available to the Board of Education,

upon the request of the Board. 38 The Board of Education shall establish guidelines for the evaluation of instructional personnel and 39 for the review by the division superintendent or his designee of an unsatisfactory evaluation.

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
