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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 3.1 a chapter numbered 27.7,
13	consisting of sections numbered 3.1-796.137, 3.1-796.138, and 3.1-796.139, as follows:
14	CHAPTER 27.7.
15 16	AGRITOURISM ACTIVITY LIABILITY. § 3.1-796.137. Definitions.
17	As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning:
18	"Agritourism activity" means any activity carried out on a farm or ranch that allows members of the
1 9	general public, for recreational, entertainment, or educational purposes, to view or enjoy rural
20	activities, including farming, ranching, historical, cultural, harvest-your-own activities, or natural
21	activities and attractions. An activity is an agritourism activity whether or not the participant paid to
22	participate in the activity.
23	"Agritourism professional" means any person who is engaged in the business of providing one or
24 25	more agritourism activities, whether or not for compensation.
25 26	"Inherent risks of agritourism activity" mean those dangers or conditions that are an integral part of an agritourism activity including certain hazards, including surface and subsurface conditions; natural
27 27	conditions of land, vegetation, and waters; the behavior of wild or domestic animals; and ordinary
28	dangers of structures or equipment ordinarily used in farming and ranching operations. Inherent risks of
29	agritourism activity also include the potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may
30	contribute to injury to the participant or others, including failing to follow instructions given by the
31	agritourism professional or failing to exercise reasonable caution while engaging in the agritourism
32	activity.
33 34	"Participant" means any person, other than an agritourism professional, who engages in an agritourism activity.
34 35	§ 3.1-796.138. Liability limited; liability actions prohibited.
36	A. Except as provided in subsection B, an agritourism professional is not liable for injury to or
37	death of a participant resulting from the inherent risks of agritourism activities, so long as the warning
38	contained in § 3.1-796.139 is posted as required and, except as provided in subsection B, no participant
39	or participant's representative is authorized to maintain an action against or recover from an
40	agritourism professional for injury, loss, damage, or death of the participant resulting exclusively from
41	any of the inherent risks of agritourism activities; provided that in any action for damages against an
42 43	agritourism professional for agritourism activity, the agritourism professional shall plead the affirmative defense of assumption of the risk of agritourism activity by the participant.
4 4	B. Nothing in subsection A shall prevent or limit the liability of an agritourism professional if the
45	agritourism professional does any one or more of the following:
46	1. Commits an act or omission that constitutes negligence or willful or wanton disregard for the
47	safety of the participant, and that act or omission proximately causes injury, damage, or death to the
48	participant;
49	2. Has actual knowledge or reasonably should have known of a dangerous condition on the land or
50 51	in the facilities or equipment used in the activity, or the dangerous propensity of a particular animal used in such activity and does not make the danger known to the participant and the danger
51 52	used in such activity and does not make the danger known to the participant, and the danger proximately causes injury, damage, or death to the participant; or
52 53	<i>3. Intentionally injures the participant.</i>
54	C. Any limitation on legal liability afforded by this section to an agritourism professional is in
55	addition to any other limitations of legal liability otherwise provided by law.
56	§ 3.1-796.139. Warning required.
57	A. Every agritourism professional shall post and maintain signs that contain the warning notice
58	specified in subsection B. The sign shall be placed in a clearly visible location at the entrance to the

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agritourism location and at the site of the agritourism activity. The warning notice shall consist of a
sign in black letters, with each letter to be a minimum of one inch in height. Every written contract
entered into by an agritourism professional for the providing of professional services, instruction, or the
rental of equipment to a participant, whether or not the contract involves agritourism activities on or off
the location or at the site of the agritourism activity, shall contain in clearly readable print the warning
notice specified in subsection B.

B. The signs and contracts described in subsection A shall contain the following notice of warning:

"WARNING: Under Virginia law, there is no liability for an injury to or death of a participant in an
agritourism activity conducted at this agritourism location if such injury or death results from the
inherent risks of the agritourism activity. Inherent risks of agritourism activities include, among others,
risks of injury inherent to land, equipment, and animals, as well as the potential for you to act in a
negligent manner that may contribute to your injury or death. You are assuming the risk of participating

71 in this agritourism activity."

72 C. Failure to comply with the requirements concerning warning signs and notices provided in this 73 section shall prevent an agritourism professional from invoking the privileges of immunity provided by 74 this chapter.
