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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 23-14 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia
13	be amended by adding in Title 23 a chapter numbered 16.6, consisting of sections numbered
14	23-231.30 through 23-231.40, as follows:
15	§ 23-14. Certain educational institutions declared governmental instrumentalities; powers vested in
16 17	majority of members of board. The College of William and Mary in Virginia, at Williamsburg; the rector and visitors of Christopher
18	Newport University, at Newport News; Longwood University, at Farmville; the University of Mary
19	Washington, at Fredericksburg; George Mason University, at Fairfax; the James Madison University, at
20	Harrisonburg; Old Dominion University, at Norfolk; the State Board for Community Colleges, at
21	Richmond; the Virginia Commonwealth University, at Richmond; the Radford University, at Radford;
22	the Roanoke Higher Education Authority and Center; the rector and visitors of the University of
23	Virginia, at Charlottesville; the University of Virginia's College at Wise; the Virginia Military Institute,
24 25	at Lexington; the Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, at Blacksburg; the Virginia Schools
25 26	for the Deaf and the Blind; the Virginia State University, at Petersburg; Norfolk State University, at Norfolk; the Woodrow Wilson Rehabilitation Center, at Fishersville; the Eastern Virginia Medical
20 27	School; the Southern Virginia Higher Education Center; the Southwest Virginia Higher Education
28	Center; and the Institute for Advanced Learning and Research; and the New College Institute are hereby
29	classified as educational institutions and are declared to be public bodies and constituted as
30	governmental instrumentalities for the dissemination of education. The powers of every such institution
31	derived directly or indirectly from this chapter shall be vested in and exercised by a majority of the
32	members of its board, and a majority of such board shall be a quorum for the transaction of any
33 34	business authorized by this chapter. Wherever the word "board" is used in this chapter, it shall be deemed to include the members of a governing body designated by another title.
34 35	CHAPTER 16.6
36	THE NEW COLLEGE INSTITUTE.
37	§ 23-231.30. The New College Institute created; responsibilities.
38	A. With such funds as are appropriated or made available for this purpose, there is hereby created
39	and constituted, in the area of Martinsville and Henry Counties, Virginia, a political subdivision of the
40	Commonwealth to be known as the New College Institute, hereinafter referred to as New College.
41 42	B. New College shall: 1. Seek to diversify the region's economy by engaging the resources of other institutions of higher
43	education, public and private bodies, and organizations of the region and state.
44	2. Serve as a catalyst for economic and community transformation by leveraging and brokering
45	resources that support economic diversity.
46	3. Provide a site for the development of the technology and trained workforce necessary for new
47	economic enterprises to flourish, using primarily the teaching, research, outreach, and technology
48	resources available from collaborating institutions and bodies.
49 50	4. Expand educational opportunities in the region by providing access to degree-granting programs,
50 51	including undergraduate, graduate, and professional programs, through partnerships with private and public institutions of higher education, the public schools, and public and private sectors.
51 52	5. Encourage and coordinate the development and delivery of programs with a reasonable focus on
53	statewide and regional critical shortage areas.
54	6. Serve as a resource and referral center by maintaining and disseminating information on existing
55	educational programs, research, and university outreach and technology resources.
56	§ 23-231.31. Board of Directors; membership; appointments; terms; compensation; officers.

\$ § 23-231.31. Board of Directors; membership; appointments; terms; compensation; officers.
A. New College shall be governed by a Board of Directors. Until July 1, 2012, the Board shall have between 12 and 15 members to be appointed by the Governor, and shall consist of the chief executives

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59 or their designees of at least three public institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth, the chief executive or his designee of at least one private institution of higher education in the 60 61 Commonwealth, and at least three residents of the region. No member may be a person holding local,

62 state, or federal elected office, and no more than two members may be nonresidents of the 63 Commonwealth.

64 B. Initial terms of appointment shall be for three years, and may be renewed for an additional term 65 that would end no later than July 1, 2012. Appointments to fill vacancies occurring otherwise than by expiration of terms shall be for the unexpired terms. 66

C. Beginning July 1, 2012, the Board of Directors shall consist of 12 members appointed by the 67 Governor, subject to confirmation by the General Assembly. Such members shall continue to hold office **68** 69 until their successors have been appointed and have qualified. Of the 12 members, no more than two 70 may be nonresidents of the Commonwealth.

71 D. Of the members first appointed by the Governor for terms beginning July 1, 2012, three shall be appointed for terms of four years, three for terms of three years, three for terms of two years, and three 72 73 for terms of one year. Subsequent appointments shall be for terms of four years provided, however, that 74 appointments to fill vacancies occurring otherwise than by expiration of terms shall be for the unexpired 75 terms.

76 E. The Board shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its members and may establish 77 bylaws as necessary.

F. Members of the Board shall not be entitled to receive compensation. All members shall be 78 79 reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as 80 provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the cost of expenses of the members shall be 81 provided by New College. 82

§ 23-231.32. Eligibility to serve for two terms.

83 No person shall be eligible to serve on the Board of Directors for or during more than two successive terms; except that after the expiration of the remainder of a term to which appointed to fill a 84 85 vacancy, a member may serve two additional terms if appointed thereto, and except that a member 86 appointed in 2006 to the Board of Directors shall be eligible to serve up to three successive terms. 87

§ 23-231.33. Removal of a member of the Board.

88 If any member of the Board fails to perform the duties of his office for one year without sufficient 89 cause shown to the Board, the Board shall, at its next meeting after the end of such year, cause the fact 90 of such failure to be recorded in the minutes of its proceedings, and certify the same to the Governor, 91 and the office of such member shall be thereupon vacant. If so many of such members fail to perform 92 their duties that a quorum thereof do not attend for a year, upon a certificate thereof being made to the Governor by the chairman or any member of the Board or by the Executive Director of New College, 93 the offices of all members so failing to attend shall be vacated. 94 95

§ 23-231.34. Powers and duties of Board; contracts for educational services.

A. The Board of Directors shall have, in addition to its other powers, all the corporate powers given 96 97 to corporations by the provisions of Title 13.1, except in those cases where, by the express terms of its 98 provisions, the law is confined to corporations created under that title. The Board shall also have the 99 power to accept, execute, and administer any trust in which it may have an interest under the terms of 100 the instrument creating the trust.

B. The Board shall oversee the educational programs of New College and also have the authority to 101 102 enter into and administer agreements with institutions of higher education to provide continuing 103 education, instructional programs, and degree programs at New College.

104 C. By no later than September 1, 2008, and September 1, 2011, the Board shall provide to the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia a report concerning the development of New College as an institution of higher education. The report shall include, but not be limited to, discussion of New 105 106 107 College's continuation as a provider of educational programs through existing institutions and 108 resources, the prospects for New College to become a branch campus of an existing public institution of higher education in the Commonwealth or the readiness of New College to become a baccalaureate 109 college. The State Council of Higher Education for Virginia shall provide an assessment of the report to 110 the Governor and General Assembly by no later than, in the given year, November 1, 2008, and 111 112 November 1, 2011. 113

§23-231.35, Rates, fees, and charges.

The Board may fix, in its discretion, the rates charged the students of New College for tuition, fees, 114 115 and other necessary charges. 116

§ 23-231.36. Degrees.

117 Upon such time that New College is recognized as a baccalaureate college and has been granted 118 such approvals as are required under the Code of Virginia to permit the exercise of such authority, the 119 Board shall have the authority to confer degrees.

120 § 23-231.37. Curriculum. 121 The Board shall direct the development and focus of New College's curriculum. Until July 1, 2012, 122 New College's curriculum shall focus on students who have completed a community college associate's 123 degree or the first and second years of a baccalaureate degree, with exceptions as appropriate. New 124 College shall enroll students by the fall semester of 2007 or as soon as practicable.

125 § 23-231-38. Sale, etc., of real estate.

126 The Board, with the approval of the Governor first obtained, is hereby authorized to lease, sell, and 127 convey any and all real estate to which New College has acquired title by gift, devise, or purchase since 128 the commencement of New College under any previous names, or which may hereafter be conveyed or 129 devised to it. The proceeds derived from any such lease, sale, or conveyance shall be held by New 130 College upon the identical trusts, and subject to the same uses, limitations, and conditions, if any, that 131 are expressed in the original deed or will under which its title has derived; or if there be no such trusts, 132 uses, limitations, or conditions expressed in such original deed or will, then such funds shall be applied

133 by the Board to such purposes as it may deem best for New College.

134 § 23-231.39. Executive Director; responsibilities.

135 The Board shall appoint an Executive Director of New College who shall supervise and manage New 136 College. The Executive Director shall be authorized, with the oversight of the Board, to employ as state 137 employees such staff and faculty as are necessary to enable New College to perform its duties as set 138 forth in this chapter and the bylaws established by the Board.

139 § 23.231-40. Gifts, grants, and donations; cooperation with other agencies.

140 The Board may, or behalf of New College, apply for, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations 141 from public or private sources to enable it to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

142 The Board may also request and accept the cooperation of agencies of the Commonwealth or the 143 local governments located in Southside Virginia in the performance of its duties.

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
