- 4 5 6 7 A BILL to amend and reenact § 2.2-2101, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, and § 23-14 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 23 a 8 chapter numbered 16.6, consisting of sections numbered 23-231.30 through 23-231.36, relating to the 9 New College Institute. 10

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

11 1. That § 2.2-2101, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, and § 23-14 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding 12 in Title 23 a chapter numbered 16.6, consisting of sections numbered 23-231.30 through 23-231.36, 13 14 as follows:

15 § 2.2-2101. (Effective until July 1, 2008) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards, 16 commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions.

17 Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs 18 established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 19 20 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the 21 appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the 22 executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 23 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another 24 person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position.

2.2-2101. (Effective July 1, 2008) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards, 47 commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions. **48**

49 Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils 50 within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 51 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the 52 53 appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the 54 executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 55 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position. 56

78 § 23-14. Certain educational institutions declared governmental instrumentalities; powers vested in 79 majority of members of board.

The powers of every such institution 93 derived directly or indirectly from this chapter shall be vested in and exercised by a majority of the 94 members of its board, and a majority of such board shall be a quorum for the transaction of any 95 business authorized by this chapter. Wherever the word "board" is used in this chapter, it shall be 96 deemed to include the members of a governing body designated by another title. 97

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CHAPTER 16.6. THE NEW COLLEGE INSTITUTE.

100 § 23-231.30. The New College Institute created; responsibilities.

A. With such funds as are appropriated or made available for this purpose, there is hereby created 101 102 and constituted, in the area of Martinsville and Henry County, Virginia, an educational institution of the 103 Commonwealth to be known as the New College Institute, hereinafter referred to as New College. 104

B. New College shall:

105 1. Seek to diversify the region's economy by engaging the resources of other institutions of higher 106 education, public and private bodies, and organizations of the region and state.

2. Serve as a catalyst for economic and community transformation by leveraging and brokering 107 108 resources that support economic diversity.

3. Facilitate development of the technology and trained workforce necessary for new economic 109 110 enterprises to flourish, using the resources available from collaborating educational institutions.

4. Expand educational opportunities in the region by providing access to degree-granting programs, 111 112 including undergraduate, graduate, and professional programs, through partnerships with private and public institutions of higher education, the public schools, and public and private sectors. 113

114 5. Encourage and coordinate the development and delivery of degree programs and other credit and noncredit courses with a focus on statewide and regional critical shortage areas as well as the needs of 115 116 industry. This shall include needed adult education and workforce training.

117 6. Serve as a resource and referral center by maintaining and disseminating information on existing 118 educational programs, research, and university outreach and technology resources.

§ 23-231.31. Board of Directors; membership; appointments; terms; compensation; officers. 119

120 A. New College shall be governed by a Board of Directors consisting of 12 members. Members of 121 the Board shall be appointed as follows: seven nonlegislative members to be appointed by the Governor,

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subject to the approval of the General Assembly; three members to be appointed by the Speaker of the
House of Delegates; and two members to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules. Of the 12
members, no more than two may be nonresidents of the Commonwealth.

Legislative members shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. After the initial
 staggering of terms, all nonlegislative citizen appointments shall be for terms of four years, except that
 appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same
 manner as the original appointments.

No nonlegislative citizen member of the Board shall be eligible to serve more than two successive
four-year terms, but after the expiration of the remainder of a term to which appointed to fill a vacancy,
two additional four-year terms may be served by such member if appointed thereto.

B. The Board shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its members and may establishbylaws as necessary.

C. Nonlegislative citizen members shall not be entitled to compensation for their services. Legislative members of the Board shall be compensated as provided in § 30-19.12, and all members of the Board shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in the work of New College as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. The funding for the costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by New College.

139 § 23-231.32. Powers and duties of Board; contracts for educational services.

A. The Board of Directors shall have, in addition to its other powers, all the corporate powers given to corporations by the provisions of Title 13.1, except in those cases where, by the express terms of its provisions, the law is confined to corporations created under that title. The Board shall also have the power to accept, execute, and administer any trust in which it may have an interest under the terms of the instrument creating the trust.

145 B. The Board shall oversee the educational programs of New College and also have the authority to
146 enter into and administer agreements with institutions of higher education for them to provide
147 continuing education, instructional programs, and degree programs at New College.

148 § 23-231.33. Curriculum.

149 The Board shall direct the development and focus of New College's curriculum. The curriculum shall
150 include appropriate degree and nondegree programs offered by other educational institutions. New
151 College shall enroll students by the fall semester of 2007 or as soon as practicable.

152 § 23-231.34. Sale, etc., of real estate.

153 The Board, with the approval of the Governor first obtained, is hereby authorized to lease, sell, and 154 convey any and all real estate to which New College has acquired title by gift, devise, or purchase since 155 the commencement of New College under any previous names, or which may hereafter be conveyed or 156 devised to it. The proceeds derived from any such lease, sale, or conveyance shall be held by New 157 College upon the identical trusts, and subject to the same uses, limitations, and conditions, if any, that 158 are expressed in the original deed or will under which its title has derived; or if there be no such trusts, 159 uses, limitations, or conditions expressed in such original deed or will, then such funds shall be applied 160 by the Board to such purposes as it may deem best for New College.

161 § 23-231.35. Executive Director; responsibilities.

The Board shall appoint an Executive Director of New College who shall supervise and manage New
College. The Executive Director shall be authorized, with the oversight of the Board, to employ such
staff and faculty as are necessary to enable New College to perform its duties as set forth in this
chapter and the bylaws established by the Board.

166 § 23-231.36. *Gifts, grants, and donations; cooperation with other agencies.*

167 The Board may, on behalf of New College, apply for, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations168 from public or private sources to enable it to carry out the purposes of this chapter.

169 The Board may also request and accept the cooperation of agencies of the Commonwealth or the 170 local governments located in Southside Virginia in the performance of its duties.
