Senate Amendments in [] — February 14, 2006

A BILL relating to the consolidation of the Virginia School for the Deaf and the Blind at Staunton and the Virginia School for the Deaf, Blind and Multi-Disabled at Hampton.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

9 1. § 1. Consolidation of the Virginia School for the Deaf and the Blind at Staunton and the Virginia
10 School for the Deaf, Blind and Multi-Disabled at Hampton; Board of Education to develop certain plan.
11 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the residential programs of the Virginia School for
12 the Deaf and the Blind at Staunton and the Virginia School for the Deaf, Blind and Multi-Disabled at
13 Hampton shall be modified as follows:

A. The Department of General Services is authorized to enter into a comprehensive agreement for
the necessary renovations, additions, and new facility construction at the Staunton campus under
traditional procurement or the Public-Private Education Facilities and Infrastructure Act of 2002.

The Department of General Services shall develop a plan for disposing of buildings and property no
longer necessary for special education purposes. The Department of General Services shall work with
the City of Staunton and the Department of Historic Resources when considering proposals that may
transfer ownership to or establish long-term leases with private entities. The properties shall be
conveyed with appropriate historic easements at fair market value with the proceeds reverting to the
general fund to offset the cost of construction of the new facility.

B. The Department of Education shall assist with the coordination with appropriate local entities for
the transition of services to a regional [day academic] program in the Hampton Roads area. The
Department of General Services, in conjunction with the Board of Education may, with the Governor's
approval, convey the current Hampton campus to an appropriate nonprofit or public entity in Hampton
Roads to facilitate these services. In addition, the Department of Education shall provide appropriate
technical assistance to regional special education programs and school divisions statewide.

29 The Department of General Services shall develop a plan for disposing of buildings and property no 30 longer necessary for special education purposes in the City of Hampton. The Department of General 31 Services shall work with the City of Hampton and the Department of Historic Resources when 32 considering proposals that may transfer ownership to or establish long-term leases with private entities. 33 The properties shall be conveyed with appropriate historic easements at fair market value with the 34 proceeds reverting to the general fund to offset the cost of construction of the new facility referenced in 35 subsection A.

C. Planning in both Hampton and Staunton shall include reuse of existing facilities as appropriateand a sensitivity to the need for preserving the history of the institutions.

38 The plan shall also include provisions for continued funding for the state-operated facility in39 Staunton and local regional day programs statewide.

40 2. That the capital project set forth in subsection A of § 1 of this act shall be funded in 41 accordance with the general appropriation act passed by the 2006 Session of the General 42 Assembly, which becomes law.
