VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY — CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 2.2-2669 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the Virginia Workforce
3 Council.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 2.2-2669 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:

8 § 2.2-2669. Virginia Workforce Council; purpose; membership; terms; compensation and expenses;
9 staff.

10 A. The Virginia Workforce Council (the Council) is established as a policy council, within the 11 meaning of § 2.2-2100, in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the Council shall be 12 to assist the Governor in meeting workforce training needs in the Commonwealth.

B. The Council shall consist have a total membership of 29 25 members, consisting of four
legislative members, 15 nonlegislative citizen members, and six ex officio members to be appointed in
accordance with the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (P.L. 105-220, as amended) as follows:

1. The Council shall include two members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker
of the House of Delegates; and two members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on
Rules. Legislative members shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office and may be
reappointed for successive terms.

2. The Governor; the Secretaries of Commerce and Trade, Education, and Health and Human
Resources; the Chancellor of the Virginia Community College System; the Commissioner of the Virginia
22 Employment Commission; and the president of the Virginia AFL-CIO shall serve as members.

23 3. The Governor shall appoint members as follows: one mayor and one chairperson of a county 24 board of supervisors; one representative of labor in addition to the president of the Virginia AFL-CIO; 25 and 15 nonlegislative citizen members representing the business community, to include the presidents of 26 the Virginia Chamber of Commerce and the Virginia Manufacturer's Association, one representative of 27 proprietary employment training schools, one representative of health care employers, and the remaining 28 members who are business owners, chief executive officers, chief operating officers, chief financial 29 officers, senior managers or other business executives or employers with optimum policy-making or 30 hiring authority and who shall represent diverse regions of the state, to include urban, suburban, and 31 rural areas, at least two of whom shall be members of local workforce investment boards. Nonlegislative 32 citizen members may be nonresidents of the Commonwealth.

33 Members appointed in accordance with this subdivision shall serve four-year terms, subject to the
34 pleasure of the Governor, and may be reappointed.

35 C. If one person appointed to fill one of the enumerated positions in subsection B also qualifies to 36 fill any other of the enumerated positions, such person may, at the discretion of the Governor, be 37 deemed to fill any or all of the enumerated positions for which such person qualifies.

38 D. The Governor shall select a chairman and vice-chairman from among the 15 members
39 representing the business community appointed in accordance with subdivision 3 of subsection B. The
40 Council shall meet upon the call of the chair or the Governor.

41 (i) two members of the Senate to be appointed by the President of the Senate, in accordance with 29 42 U.S.C.S. § 2821, and two members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the 43 House; (ii) one nonlegislative citizen member who shall be either a business owner, chief executive 44 officer, chief operating officer, chief financial officer, senior manager, or other business executive or 45 employer with optimum policymaking or hiring authority to be appointed from among two candidates, by the Governor, upon the recommendation of the Senate Committee on Rules; (iii) three nonlegislative 46 citizen members who shall be business owners, chief executive officers, chief operating officers, chief 47 financial officers, senior managers, or other business executives or employers with optimum policymaking or hiring authority to be appointed from among six candidates, by the Governor, upon the **48** 49 50 recommendation of the Speaker of the House; (iv) 11 nonlegislative citizen members to be appointed by the Governor as follows: one mayor; one chairperson of a county board of supervisors; the president of 51 the Virginia Chamber of Commerce; the president of the Virginia AFL-CIO; the president of the 52 53 Virginia Manufacturer's Association; one representative of the business community; one representative of 54 proprietary employment training schools; one representative of health care employers; three members 55 who shall be either business owners, chief executive officers, chief operating officers, chief financial 56 officers, senior managers or other business executives or employers with optimum policymaking or

hiring authority, of whom two shall also be members of local workforce investment boards, and 57 58 represent the geographical regions of the Commonwealth, including urban, suburban, and rural areas; 59 and (v) the Governor, the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, the Secretary of Education, the Secretary 60 of Health and Human Resources, the Chancellor of the Virginia Community College System, and the

61 Commissioner of the Virginia Employment Commission to serve ex officio with voting privileges. 62 In selecting a mayor and a chairperson of a county board of supervisors, the Governor shall give due consideration to officials with a strong business background. 63

If a person appointed to the Council qualifies to fill one or more of the enumerated positions, the 64 65 person may, at the discretion of the Governor, be deemed to fill any one or all of the enumerated 66 positions for which he qualifies.

67 Nonlegislative citizen members may be nonresidents of the Commonwealth. Legislative members and 68 appointed and elected officials shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. Nonlegislative citizen members shall serve four-year terms, subject to the pleasure of the Governor. Appointments to 69 fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. All members may be reappointed. However, no 70 71 72 Senate member shall serve more than two consecutive four-year terms, no House member shall serve 73 more than four consecutive two-year terms, and no nonlegislative citizen member shall serve more than 74 two consecutive four-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill a 75 vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment.

76 C. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The Governor shall select a chairman and 77 vice chairman of the Council from among the members representing the business community as provided 78 in subdivision (iv) of subsection B. The Council shall meet upon the call of the chairman or the 79 Governor. 80

E. Compensation and reimbursement of expenses of the members shall be as follows:

1. D. Legislative members appointed in accordance with subdivision B 1 shall receive such 81 compensation and reimbursement of expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in 82 83 §§ 30-19.12, 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825.

84 2. Members of the Council appointed in accordance with subdivision B 2 shall not receive 85 compensation but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. 86

3. Members of the Council appointed in accordance with subdivision B 3 shall not receive 87 88 compensation but shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the 89 performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825.

90 of the Council shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12, and nonlegislative citizen

91 members shall receive such compensation for the performance of their duties as provided in § 2.2-2813. All members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance 92 of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. 93

94 Funding for the costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided from federal 95 funds received under the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (P.L. 105-220, as amended) and

96 administered by the Virginia Employment Commission. 97 F E. The Virginia Employment Commission, the Virginia Community College System, and the 98 Department of Business Assistance Governor, or a senior staff member within his immediate office to 99 whom the Governor has delegated responsibility for workforce development, shall serve as lead staff to the Council as directed by the Secretary of Commerce and Trade. The Virginia Employment 100 Commission shall act as fiscal agent for the Council and the WIA Council's lead staff shall supervise 101

102 the subordinate staff of the Council. The subordinate staff of the Council shall be independent of any 103 other state agency that provides workforce services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide 104 assistance to the Council, upon request.

105 2. That the provisions of this act shall expire on July 1, 2009.
