4 5 6 7 Requesting the Secretary of Transportation and the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner to explore the feasibility and desirability of entering into an interstate compact for the construction and operation of a controlled access highway between Dover, Delaware, and Interstate Route 95 southwest of Charleston, South Carolina, with their counterparts in the states of Delaware, 8 9 Maryland, North Carolina, and South Carolina. Report.

11 WHEREAS, a controlled access highway providing an alternative to Interstate Route 95 for use by long-distance travelers between Delaware and South Carolina could allow such traffic to bypass the 12 highly congested Washington, D.C., metropolitan area; and 13

WHEREAS, existence of such a highway would be beneficial to both commercial and 14 15 noncommercial traffic, help alleviate congestion in the Interstate Route 95 Corridor, provide an important evacuation route in case of natural disaster or terrorist attack, contribute to air quality 16 17 improvement, and benefit the economies of all the states through which it passes; and

18 WHEREAS, it may be both desirable and feasible to finance construction of such a facility through 19 issuance of bonds supported by imposition and collection of tolls for use of the facility; and

20 WHEREAS, establishment of an interstate compact may be helpful in constructing, financing, and 21 operating such a facility; now, therefore, be it

22 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Secretary of Transportation 23 and the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner be requested to explore the feasibility and 24 desirability of entering into an interstate compact for the construction and operation of a controlled access highway between Dover, Delaware, and Interstate Route 95 southwest of Charleston, South 25 Carolina, with their counterparts in the states of Delaware, Maryland, North Carolina, and South 26 27 Carolina. Such facility would follow U.S. Route 13 from Dover, Delaware, through Salisbury, Maryland, 28 across the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel, along the Southeast Expressway in Virginia Beach and the 29 Dominion Boulevard Connector in Chesapeake to the U.S. Route 17 Corridor through North Carolina 30 and South Carolina, and join Interstate Route 95 southwest of Charleston, South Carolina. In addition, if 31 the Secretary and the Commissioner determine that construction of the facility proposed herein is 32 desirable and feasible, they shall jointly submit such legislative recommendations as may be necessary to 33 facilitate the construction and operation of the facility.

34 Technical assistance shall be provided to the Secretary of Transportation and the Commonwealth 35 Transportation Commissioner by the Virginia Department of Transportation. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Secretary and the Commissioner, upon request. 36

37 The Secretary and the Commissioner shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems 38 an executive summary of the results of their consultations no later than the first day of the 2008 Regular 39 Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary and any legislative recommendations shall be 40 submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the Division of 41 Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 42

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
