3 Celebrating the life of Jeremiah Jonathan Jewett.

5 6 WHEREAS, Jeremiah Jonathan Jewett of Midlothian, a respected citizen, public servant, and 7 community benefactor, died on October 8, 2005; and WHEREAS, Jeremiah "Jerry" Jewett was born on May 2, 1925, graduated from Thomas Jefferson 8 9 High School, earned an undergraduate degree from the University of Richmond, and received a law degree from the T.C. Williams School of Law; and 10 WHEREAS, during World War II, Jerry Jewett served his country in the United States Army Air 11 12 Force: and 13 WHEREAS, after the war, Jerry Jewett married his wife, Patsy, and they lived in The Sycamores at his family home, which is now Crab Louie's Restaurant; the couple sold the homestead to the developers 14 15 of Sycamore Square in 1975; and WHEREAS, Jerry Jewett was admitted to the bar in 1949 and began his practice of law at 16 Chesterfield Court House with Jewett and Gates, where he remained to work for successor firms; and 17 WHEREAS, in 1956, the Chesterfield Jaycees named Jerry Jewett its Young Man of the Year for his 18 19 many contributions to the community; and WHEREAS, active in civic and political affairs, Jerry Jewett represented Chesterfield, Henrico, and Colonial Heights in the House of Delegates for one term in 1960; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, committed to improving the quality of life for his fellow citizens, Jerry Jewett served as vice chairman of the Richmond Regional Planning Commission, chairman of the Chesterfield Board of 23 24 Real Estate Assessors, and a member of the Chesterfield Draft Board; and 25 WHEREAS, concerned for the well-being of his neighbors, Jerry Jewett served as president of the 26 Midlothian Ruritan Club and was a member of the Midlothian Volunteer Fire Department for 18 years; 27 and 28 WHEREAS, in 1977, Jerry Jewett retired from the law and began a second career as a real estate 29 broker and developer, and was involved in numerous projects in the Richmond area; and 30 WHEREAS, an amateur historian, genealogist, and former trustee of the Chesterfield Historical 31 Society, Jerry Jewett was often consulted on Chesterfield history; and WHEREAS, Jerry Jewett was also a founding member of Willow Oaks Country Club, Salisbury 32 33 Country Club, and the Federal Hill Club; and WHEREAS, Jerry Jewett will be fondly remembered for his compassion and generosity and sorely 34 35 missed by his family, his numerous friends and colleagues, and the citizens of Midlothian and 36 Chesterfield County; now, therefore, be it 37 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly mourn 38 the passing of an outstanding Virginian, Jeremiah Jonathan Jewett; and, be it 39 RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for 40 presentation to the family of Jeremiah Jonathan Jewett as an expression of the General Assembly's respect for his memory. 41
