WHEREAS, Maya Davis won the Best Interview award and the talent competition to capture the title of Miss Pre-Teen Virginia; and

WHEREAS, as the winner of the Pre-Teen Virginia, Junior Division, Maya Davis received a \$1,200 educational bond and other gifts and will represent the Commonwealth in the 2006 Pre-Teen America National Competition in Alabama; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend Maya Davis on being named Miss Pre-Teen Virginia; and, be it
