5.	Summary/Purpose: This bill provides that classroom training and behind-the-wheel instruction offered by the Association of Christian Schools International and the Virginia Council of Private Education must be considered for approval by the Board of Education.
6.	Fiscal Impact Estimates are: Preliminary. See Item 8 below.
7.	Budget amendment necessary: No.
8.	Fiscal implications: Together, the Association of Christian Schools International and the Virginia Council of Private Education comprise approximately 70 different entities. This legislation may increase the number of applications for a Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) Commercial Driver Training School license, although the number of potential new applicants cannot be determined. These entities would be required to obtain approval for the course curriculum from the Board of Education prior to making application to DMV for a school license. There is an annual \$100 school fee and an annual \$50 instructor fee for each school program that seeks licensing. These fees would somewhat offset the additional inspection, assessment, and licensing activities attributable to any potential new applications. Currently, there is not enough information to reliably estimate the number of entities that will choose to seek licensing; therefore, no determination can be made as to the potential revenue impact to the Board of Education.
