4. Title Sexually violent predators.

5. Summary/Purpose: This bill establishes within the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, the Office of Sexually Violent Predator Services to administer provisions relating to the civil commitment of sexually violent predators.

6. No Fiscal Impact

7. Budget amendment necessary: No

8. Fiscal implications: The bill as drafted has no fiscal impact, as DMHMRSAS is already performing the functions required by the language. However, if proposed sentencing statute changes are adopted, DMHMRSAS will be managing a significantly larger sexually violent predator program. The Virginia State Crime Commission has provided recommendations for increased staffing and funding levels to support the Office of the SVP. After revising their initial estimates, the Commission has recommended \$302,458 and 4 positions in FY07 and \$446,824 and 5 positions in FY08.
