5.	Summary/Purpose: The bill would require the Secretary of Natural Resources to develop a plan for the cleanup of the Chesapeake Bay and Virginia's waters designated as impaired by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The plan must address both point and nonpoint sources of pollution. The Secretary of Natural Resources must submit the impaired waters clean-up plan no later than January 1, 2007, to the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources, the House Committee on Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources, and the Senate Committee on Finance. Thereafter, a progress report on the implementation of the plan must be submitted semiannually to these oversight committees. The bill also requires that the Virginia Resources Authority provide to the Secretary of Natural Resources alternative funding mechanisms to carry out the provisions of the bill.
