Current Law

On a monthly basis, the clerk of every circuit court is required to forward to the county or city's commissioner of revenue and to the Department a copy of the recordation receipt for all deeds for the partition and conveyance of land, other than deeds of trust and mortgages, which were recorded in the previous month.
