5. Summary/Purpose: This bill requires the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to provide 48-hour advance notification to the sheriff of the committing jurisdiction and to any registered victims or next of kin of victims anytime and every time a Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity (NGRI) acquittee has been granted permission to leave a facility for any length of time.

- **8. Fiscal implications:** Implementation of this bill would result in a significant increase in workload to meet the expanded notification requirements. There are currently 115 NGRI's who have community privileges and may request leave. The Commonwealth's Attorney receives written notification of NGRI acquittees authorized for certain types of temporary leave from facility grounds. This bill expands notification requirements to any and all types of temporary leave; and, it triples the number of people to receive notification by adding the sheriff and victim (or victim's next of kin). Current resources are not sufficient to absorb the additional workload anticipated as a result of the legislation. It is projected that two positions, located at two separate facilities, at an on-going cost of \$89,331 will be needed. The FY 2007 projection includes one-time start-up costs of \$5,000.
