- 5. Summary/Purpose: The bill allows any person engaged in the creation and operation of wetlands mitigation banks in multiple jurisdictions, which are permitted by the Department of Environmental Quality, the Marine Resources Commission or the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, to file general erosion and sediment control specifications annually with the Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board for its review and approval. The board shall have 60 days in which to approve the specifications, and individual approval of separate projects is not required when approved specifications are implemented through a project-specific erosion and sediment control plan.
