- 7. Budget amendment necessary: Yes. Item 362 (Water Protection).
- 8. Fiscal implications: The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) must develop 1,210 total maximum daily loads (TMDLs) for impaired waters, 147 of which must be developed over the next biennium pursuant to a federal court-ordered schedule for TMDL development. DEQ estimates that it would need an additional six positions through FY 2010 in order to perform the evaluations required by the bill while still complying with the court-ordered schedule. The six positions include two economists (\$190,000 annual costs for salaries and

fringe benefits) as well as four environmental specialists (\$304,000 annual costs for salaries and fringe benefits). In addition, the agency estimates it would need \$506,000 annually through FY 2010 for increased contractual services costs necessary to meet the compliance schedule for TMDL development, as well as for overhead support.
