Summary/Purpose:** The bill would provide that if an aggrieved party presents to the State Water Control Board reasonable grounds indicating that the attainment of the designated use for a water is not feasible, then the Board, after public notice and at least 30 days provided for public comment, may allow the aggrieved party to conduct a use attainability analysis according to criteria established pursuant to the Clean Water Act and a schedule established by the Board. If applicable, the schedule would also address whether total maximum daily load development or implementation for the water should be delayed.
