5.	• Summary/Purpose: This bill creates the Office of Small Business Advocacy within the Department of Business Assistance. The bill sets out the powers and duties of the Office. The bill defines small business as an independently owned and operated business which, together with affiliates, has 250 or fewer employees, or average annual gross receipts of \$10 million or less averaged over the previous three years.	
6.	• Fiscal Impact: According to the Department of Business Assistance (DBA), creating the Office of Small Business Advocacy would require the hiring of two full-time employees – a Public Relations & Marketing Specialist V, hired at a base salary of \$65,000, and a Program Administrator Specialist II, hired at a base salary of \$40,000. Total cost for the Office of Small Business Advocacy, including salary & benefits, supplies and materials, travel, and one time equipment costs, is estimated to be \$154,444 for FY2007 and an on-going cost of \$149,444 (excluding one time equipment costs of \$5,000). DBA will provide the necessary office space, furniture, and IT services for the two new positions.
