Prohibits state agencies and localities from denying use of certain public facilities to the Boy Scouts of America and the Girl Scouts of the USA.

Fiscal implications:** This proposal requires state and local government entities to apply the same real property and use policies to the Scouts as with any other private organization that is allowed use of the real property.
