5. Summary/Purpose:

Establishes the state junior resident hunting license, which can be obtained by any resident under the age of 16 for a fee of \$10. The license entitles the youth to trap throughout the state. Currently, a resident under the age of 16 may hunt in the state provided that individual is accompanied by a licensed hunter.
