- 7. Budget amendment necessary: Yes, 292 Community Health Services (44000).
- 8. Fiscal implications: The number of records eligible for destruction in Virginia's local health departments annually is unknown. Before records are destroyed, they are boxed and the date span on the box is advertised for patients to pickup. The boxes are not routinely opened before destruction. Based on the current patient load, number of new patients, and the 10 year retention period, the number of records to be destroyed is estimated to be 10% of the current volume or 375,000 records. VDH currently complies with the publishing requirements identified in this bill and does not anticipate added advertising expense. The cost involved with implementing this initiative would include postage and mailing supplies to individually notify each of these patients. The estimated cost per notification would be 75 cents making the total fiscal impact \$281,250.
