4. Title Alcoholic beverage control; operation of government stores by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

5. Summary/Purpose: Authorizes the ABC Board to appoint the holder of a distiller's license or its officers and employees as agents of the Board for the sale of alcoholic beverages at government stores established by the Board upon the distiller's licensed premises. Such agents shall sell alcoholic beverages in accordance with ABC law, Board regulations, and the terms of the agency agreement between the Board and the distiller. The bill also requires the distiller to have grown at least 51 percent of the agricultural products used for the manufacture of the spirits.
