5. Summary/Purpose:

Creates the Office of Learning Technology within the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia (SCHEV) to facilitate and coordinate the voluntary participation of public and private institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth in technology-enriched initiatives.

8. Fiscal implications:

According to the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia, the programmatic intentions of this legislation are to provide seed money of \$500,000 in general fund support for each of the first two years, and have the program be self sufficient thereafter. SCHEV believes it will

require one position, at a cost of \$103,000, per year to administer this program. It is anticipated that nongeneral funds would then be generated by grants and donations to continue support for this program in future biennia.
