4. Title Sexually violent predators.

5. Summary/Purpose: Authorizes the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services (DMHMRSAS) to contract with the Department of Corrections (DOC) to provide services for the monitoring and supervision of civilly committed sexually violent predators who are on conditional release.

6. Fiscal Impact Estimates are: Tentative

7. Budget amendment necessary: Yes

8. Fiscal implications: This bill authorizes DMHMRSAS to contract with DOC for monitoring and supervision of those on conditional release. Per person contract cost is estimated at \$13,300, which includes the use of a Global Positioning System (GPS) for each person. Without significant historical detail on the size of the population that may be eligible for conditional release, it is difficult to estimate the true cost of the bill. However, if proposed changes in the sentencing statute are adopted, FY07 contract costs are estimated at \$146,300 while FY08 costs are estimated at \$412,300. The estimated cost of the contract includes the GPS monitoring device as well as projected costs at DOC to implement a monitoring program.
