4. Title Unemployment compensation; benefit disqualification.

5. Summary/Purpose: Disqualifies a public school teacher for unemployment compensation benefits if the individual's teaching contract is not renewed as a result of a failure to comply with the school board's licensure or certification requirements.

6. Fiscal Impact Estimates are: See Item 8.

7. Budget amendment necessary: No.

8. Fiscal implications: This legislation could result in a savings to local school divisions because they would not be required to provide unemployment compensation benefits for individuals whose teacher contracts are not renewed as a result of a failure to comply with the school board's licensure or certification requirements. However, it is unknown how many teachers would be affected by such legislation which makes it impossible to reliably estimate how much savings this bill would generate.
