The bill establishes a minimum reportable amount for the holder of unclaimed property. The bill exempts holders from reporting unclaimed property of any single owner if the cumulative value of the owner's unclaimed property is \$50 or less.

7. Budget amendment necessary: Yes. Item 135.

- 8. Fiscal implications: This legislation would impact the Direct Aid for Public Education budget in fiscal year 2008. The Governor's Introduced Budget (HB/SB 30) includes \$20 million from the Literary Fund for the interest rate subsidy program and \$5 million in uncommitted balances of the Fund that are available for loans to school divisions. Assuming a reduction of \$11 million in the Literary Fund in each year of the 2006-2008 biennium (based on the Department of Treasury's estimate), the budget for the interest rate subsidy program would be reduced to \$14 million in fiscal year 2008 and there would be no uncommitted balances available for loans.
