069575380 **HOUSE BILL NO. 5028** 1 2 Offered July 31, 2006 3 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 33.1-23.2 and 33.1-23.4 of the Code of Virginia, relating to allocation 4 of construction funds for primary and secondary system highways. 5 Patrons—Lingamfelter and Frederick 6 7 Referred to Committee on Transportation 8 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 10 1. That §§ 33.1-23.2 and 33.1-23.4 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: § 33.1-23.2. Allocation of construction funds for primary system and interstate match. 11 A. The Commonwealth Transportation Board shall allocate such funds as are available under 12 13 § 33.1-23.1 B 1 to the primary system of state highways, including the arterial network, for construction 14 and shall apportion such funds among the nine construction districts so that each construction district 15 shall be allocated a share of such funds equal to the proportion that such construction district bears to the Commonwealth as a whole in terms of: vehicle-miles traveled on the primary system, primary road 16 lane mileage and a primary road need factor which adjusts the weights in the allocation formula for the 17 construction district with the largest under-allocation relative to primary needs, with vehicle-miles 18 19 traveled weighted seventy percent, primary road lane mileage weighted twenty five percent, and the 20 primary road need factor weighted five percent population. For the purposes of this subsection, the term "population" shall mean either population according to 21 22 the latest United States census or the latest population estimate of the Center for Public Service of the 23 University of Virginia, whichever is more recent. 24 B. Out of each district's total allocation of primary funds pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection B of 25 § 33.1-23.1, the Board shall allocate all needed interstate federal-aid matching funds, up to a maximum 26 of twenty-five percent of the district's primary allocation. Any additional interstate federal-aid matching 27 funds needed in a district shall be allocated by the Board from the Interstate Federal-Aid Matching Fund 28 established in § 33.1-23.1:2. 29 C. Notwithstanding subsection A of this section, the Board may provide for exceptionally heavy 30 expenditures for repairs or replacements made necessary by highway damage resulting from accidents, 31 severe weather conditions, acts of God or vandalism. 32 D. Such funds allocated to the primary system shall, as far as possible, be allotted prior to the 33 commencement of the fiscal year and public announcement made of such allotment but the Board shall not approve such allotment until after a public hearing at which political subdivisions of the 34 35 Commonwealth and interested citizens may be heard. 36 In any case where any allotment of funds is made under this subsection to any county, all or a part 37 of which subsequently is incorporated as or into a city or town, such allocation shall not be impaired thereby and the funds so allocated shall be expended as if such county or any part thereof had never 38 39 become an incorporated city, but that portion of such city shall not be eligible to receive funds as a city 40 during the same year it receives the funds allocated as a county or as any part of a county. 41 § 33.1-23.4. Allocation of construction funds within secondary system. 42 A. Such funds as are allocated to the secondary system of state highways pursuant to paragraph 3 of subsection B of § 33.1-23.1 shall be apportioned among the several counties in the secondary system by 43 the Commonwealth Transportation Board so that each such county shall be allocated a share of such 44 45 funds equal to the proportion that such county bears to the Commonwealth as a whole in terms of area and population with population being weighted 80 percent, and area being weighted 20 percent. For the 46 purpose of this section, "area" means the total land area of a county reduced by the area of any military 47 48 reservations and state or national parks or forests within its boundaries and such other similar areas and 49 facilities of five square miles in area or more, as may be determined by the Commonwealth 50 Transportation Board population. 51 For the purposes of this section, the term "population" shall mean either population according to the 52 latest United States census or the latest population estimate of the Center for Public Service of the 53 University of Virginia, whichever is more recent. If so requested in a resolution adopted by the local governing body, funds allocated to any county 54 55 under this section may be used to support primary highway system construction projects within the 56 county.

57 Before allocating funds under the foregoing provisions of this section, the Board may provide for 58 exceptionally heavy expenditures for repairs or replacements made necessary by highway damage 59 resulting from accidents, severe weather conditions, acts of God or vandalism.

60 B. Notwithstanding other provisions of this section, not more than one-third of the annual secondary 61 system highway funds apportioned to a county under this section may be used to reimburse the county 62 for (i) debt service for bonds or (ii) eligible project costs incurred on approved projects included in the county's Secondary Six-Year Plan and the county's capital improvement program. Such funds may also 63 64 be used by the county for debt service for bonds issued for, or eligible project costs incurred or to be 65 incurred on, approved projects included, at the time such bonds are issued or such costs are incurred or are to be incurred, in the Six-Year Improvement Program of the Commonwealth Transportation Board 66 and the county's capital improvement program. Any such funds so apportioned to and received by such 67 county, or any portion thereof, may be deposited in a special fund that shall be established separate and 68 69 apart from any other funds, general or special.

70 When a county presents a resolution requesting that a portion of its annual secondary construction 71 allocation be set aside for reimbursement for, or payment of, debt service under this section for a 72 specific eligible project, the Commonwealth Transportation Board shall, subject to appropriation and 73 allocation, set aside no more than one-third of the anticipated annual allocation of secondary system 74 construction funding to the county for such purpose, provided such funds have not been previously 75 committed for projects contained in the county's Secondary Six-Year Plan.

76 The setting aside and use of funds under this section for reimbursement for, or payment of, debt
77 service shall be subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Commonwealth
78 Transportation Commissioner.

79 The provisions of this section shall not constitute a debt or obligation of the Commonwealth80 Transportation Board or the Commonwealth of Virginia.
