WHEREAS, India Meissel will also present an overview on an interdisciplinary approach to lessons on the Holocaust, along with fellow-teacher Debbie MacInnes; and

WHEREAS, a gifted and dedicated educator, India Meissel is an inspirational role model for her fellow teachers across the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend India Meissel on her well-deserved recognition as the 2006-2007 National Outstanding Secondary Social Studies Teacher of the Year; and, be it
