4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 15.2-2305 of the Code of Virginia, relating to affordable dwelling
5	units.

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That § 15.2-2305 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12 13	§ 15.2-2305. Affordable dwelling unit ordinances. A. In furtherance of the purpose of providing affordable shelter for all residents of the
13 14	Commonwealth, the governing body of any county, other than counties to which § 15.2-2304 applies,
15	city or town may by amendment to the zoning ordinances of such locality provide for an affordable
16	housing dwelling unit program. Such program shall address housing needs, promote a full range of
17	housing choices, and encourage the construction and continued existence of moderately priced housing
18	by providing for optional increases in density in order to reduce land costs for such moderately priced
19 20	housing. Any local ordinance of any locality providing optional increases in density for provision of low
20 21	and moderate income housing adopted before December 31, 1988, shall continue in full force and effect. Any local ordinance may authorize the governing body to (i) establish qualifying jurisdiction-wide
22	affordable dwelling unit sales prices based on local market conditions, (ii) establish jurisdiction-wide
23	affordable dwelling unit qualifying income guidelines, and (iii) offer incentives other than density
24	increases, such as reductions or waiver of permit, development, and infrastructure fees, as the governing
25	body deems appropriate to encourage the provision of affordable housing. Counties to which
26 27	§ 15.2-2304 applies shall be governed by the provisions of § 15.2-2304 for purposes of the adoption of
27 28	an affordable dwelling unit ordinance. B. A zoning ordinance establishing an affordable housing dwelling unit program may include, among
2 9	other things, reasonable regulations and provisions as to any or all of the following:
30	1. For a definition of affordable housing and affordable dwelling units.
31	2. For application of the requirements of an affordable housing dwelling unit program to any site, as
32	defined by the locality, or a portion thereof at one location which is the subject of an application for
33 34	rezoning or special exception or, at the discretion of the local governing body, site plan or subdivision
34	plat which yields, as submitted by the applicant, fifty or more dwelling units at an equivalent density greater than one unit per acre and which is located within an approved sewer area.
36	3. For an increase of up to twentythirty percent in the developable density of each site subject to the
37	ordinance and for a provision requiring up to twelve and one-half seventeen percent of the total units
38	approved, including the optional density increase, to be affordable dwelling units, as defined in the
	ordinance. In the event a twentythirty percent increase is not achieved, the percentage of affordable
40 41	dwelling units required shall maintain the same ratio of twenty thirty percent to twelve and one-half
42	<i>seventeen</i> percent. 4. For increases by up to twentythirty percent of the density or of the lower and upper end of the
43	density range set forth in the comprehensive plan of such locality applicable to rezoning and special
44	exception applications that request approval of single family detached dwelling units or single family
45	attached dwelling units, when such applications are approved after the effective date of a local
46	affordable housing zoning ordinance amendment.
47 48	5. For a requirement that not less than twelve and one-halfseventeen percent of the total number of dwelling units approved pursuant to a zoning ordinance amendment enacted pursuant to subdivision B 4
40 49	of this section shall be affordable dwelling units, as defined by the local zoning ordinance unless
50	reduced by the twenty to twelve and one-half percent ratio pursuant to subdivision B 3 of this section.
51	6. For increases by up to ten percent of the density or of the lower and upper end of the density
52	range, whichever is appropriate, set forth in the comprehensive plan of such locality applicable to
53 54	rezoning and special exception or, at the discretion of the local governing body, site plan and
54 55	subdivision plat applications that request approval of nonelevator multiple family dwelling unit structures four stories or less in height when such applications are approved after the effective date of a local
55 56	affordable housing zoning ordinance. However, at the option of the applicant, the provision pursuant to
57	subdivision B 4 shall apply.
58	7. For a requirement that not less than six and one-quarter percent of the total number of dwelling

59 units approved pursuant to a zoning ordinance amendment enacted pursuant to subdivision B 6 of this 60 section shall be affordable dwelling units, as defined in the local zoning ordinance. In the event a ten percent increase is not achieved, the percentage of affordable dwelling units required shall maintain the 61

62 same ratio of ten percent to six and one-quarter percent.

63 8. For reasonable regulations requiring the affordable dwelling units to be built and offered for sale 64 or rental concurrently with the construction and certificate of occupancy of a reasonable proportion of 65 the market rate units.

66 9. For standards of compliance with the provisions of an affordable housing dwelling unit program and for the authority of the local governing body or its designee to enforce compliance with such 67 standards and impose reasonable penalties for noncompliance, provided that a local zoning ordinance 68 69 provide for an appeal process for any party aggrieved by a decision of the local governing body. 70

C. Nothing contained in this section shall apply to any elevator structure four stories or above.

71 DC. Any ordinance adopted hereunder shall provide that the local governing body shall have no more than 280 days in which to process site or subdivision plans proposing the development or 72 construction of affordable housing or affordable dwelling units under such ordinance. The calculation of 73 74 such period of review shall include only the time that plans are in review by the local governing body and shall not include such time as may be required for revision or modification in order to comply with 75 lawful requirements set forth in applicable ordinances and regulations. 76

77 ED. A locality establishing an affordable housing dwelling unit program in its zoning ordinance shall 78 establish in its general ordinances, adopted in accordance with the requirements of § 15.2-1427 B, 79 reasonable regulations and provisions as to any or all of the following:

80 1. For administration and regulation by a local housing authority or by the local governing body or 81 its designee of the sale and rental of affordable units.

2. For a local housing authority or local governing body or its designee to have an exclusive right to 82 83 purchase up to one-third of the for-sale affordable housing dwelling units within a development within ninety days of a dwelling unit being completed and ready for purchase, provided that the remaining 84 85 two-thirds of such units be offered for sale exclusively for a ninety-day period to persons who meet the 86 income criteria established by the local housing authority or local governing body or the latter's 87 designee.

88 3. For a local housing authority or local governing body or its designee to have an exclusive right to 89 lease up to a specified percentage of the rental affordable dwelling units within a development within a 90 controlled period determined by the housing authority or local governing body or its designee, provided 91 that the remaining for-rental affordable dwelling units within a development be offered to persons who 92 meet the income criteria established by the local housing authority or local governing body or its 93 designee.

94 $\overline{4}$. For the establishment of jurisdiction-wide affordable dwelling unit sales prices by the local 95 housing authority or local governing body or the latter's designee, initially and adjusted semiannually, 96 based on a determination of all ordinary, necessary and reasonable costs required to construct the 97 affordable dwelling unit prototype dwellings by private industry after considering written comment by 98 the public, local housing authority or advisory body to the local governing body, and other information 99 such as the area's current general market and economic conditions, provided that sales prices not include 100 the cost of land, on-site sales commissions and marketing expenses, but may include, among other costs, 101 builder-paid permanent mortgage placement costs and buy-down fees and closing costs except prepaid 102 expenses required at settlement.

103 5. For the establishment of jurisdiction-wide affordable dwelling unit rental prices by a local housing authority or local governing body or its designee, initially and adjusted semiannually, based on a 104 determination of all ordinary, necessary and reasonable costs required to construct and market the 105 required number of affordable dwelling rental units by private industry in the area, after considering 106 107 written comment by the public, local housing authority, or advisory body to the local governing body, 108 and other information such as the area's current general market and economic conditions.

109 6. For a requirement that the prices for resales and rerentals be controlled by the local housing 110 authority or local governing body or designee for a period of fifty years after the initial sale or rental 111 transaction for each affordable dwelling unit, provided that the ordinance further provide for reasonable 112 rules and regulations to implement a price control provision.

113 7. For establishment of an affordable dwelling unit advisory board which shall, among other things, advise the jurisdiction on sales and rental prices of affordable dwelling units; advise the housing 114 115 authority or local governing body or its designees on requests for modifications of the requirements of 116 an affordable dwelling unit program; adopt regulations concerning its recommendations of sales and 117 rental prices of affordable dwelling units; and adopt procedures concerning requests for modifications of an affordable housing dwelling unit program. Members of the board, to be ten in number and to be 118 119 appointed by the governing body, shall be qualified as follows: two members shall be either civil engineers or architects, each of whom shall be registered or certified with the relevant agency of the 120

Commonwealth, or planners, all of whom shall have extensive experience in practice in the locality; one 121 122 member shall be a real estate salesperson or broker, licensed in accordance with Chapter 21 123 (§ 54.1-2100 et seq.) of Title 54.1; one member shall be a representative of a lending institution which 124 finances residential development in the locality; four members shall consist of a representative from a 125 local housing authority or local governing body or its designee, a residential builder with extensive 126 experience in producing single-family detached and attached dwelling units, a residential builder with 127 extensive experience in producing multiple-family dwelling units, and a representative from either the 128 public works or planning department of the locality; one member may be a representative of a nonprofit 129 housing organization which provides services in the locality; and one citizen of the locality. At least four 130 members of the advisory board shall be employed in the locality.

8. The sales and rental price for affordable dwelling units within a development shall be established such that the owner/applicant shall not suffer economic loss as a result of providing the required affordable dwelling units. "Economic loss" for sales units means that result when the owner or applicant of a development fails to recoup the cost of construction and certain allowances as may be determined by the designee of the governing body for the affordable dwelling units, exclusive of the cost of land acquisition and cost voluntarily incurred but not authorized by the ordinance, upon the sale of an affordable dwelling unit.
