10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 54.1-2408.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 54.1-2408.1. Summary action against licenses, certificates, registrations, or multistate licensure
13	privilege; allegations to be in writing.
14	A. Any health regulatory board may suspend the license, certificate, registration or multistate
15	licensure privilege of any person holding a license, certificate, registration, or licensure privilege issued
16 17	by it without a hearing simultaneously with the institution of proceedings for a hearing, if the relevant board finds that there is a substantial danger to the public health or safety which warrants this action. A
18	board may meet by telephone conference call when summarily suspending a license, certificate,
10 19	registration, or licensure privilege if a good faith effort to assemble a quorum of the board has failed
20	and, in the judgment of a majority of the members of the board, the continued practice by the individual
20 21	constitutes a substantial danger to the public health or safety. Institution of proceedings for a hearing
22	shall be provided simultaneously with the summary suspension. The hearing shall be scheduled within a
23	reasonable time of the date of the summary suspension.
24	B. Any health regulatory board may restrict the license, certificate, registration or multistate
25	licensure privilege of any person holding a license, certificate, registration, or licensure privilege issued
26	by it without proceeding simultaneously with notification of an informal conference pursuant to
27	§§ 2.2-4019 and 54.1-2400, if the relevant board finds that there is a substantial danger to the public
28	health or safety that warrants this action. A board may meet by telephone conference call when
29	summarily restricting a license, certificate, registration, or licensure privilege if a good faith effort to

assemble a quorum of the board has failed and, in the judgment of a majority of the members of the
board, the continued practice by the individual constitutes a substantial danger to the public health or
safety. The informal conference shall be scheduled within a reasonable time of the date of the summary
restriction.

BC. Allegations of violations of this title shall be made in writing to the relevant health regulatory board.
