7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That § 54.1-3807 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted, and that the Code of 9 Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 38 of Title 54.1 a section numbered 54.1-3813 as 10 follows:

§ 54.1-3807. Refusal to grant and to renew; revocation and suspension of licenses and registrations.

12 The Board may refuse to grant or to renew, may suspend or revoke any license to practice veterinary 13 medicine or to practice as a veterinary technician or registration to practice as an equine dental 14 technician if such applicant or holder:

1. Is convicted of any felony or of any misdemeanor involving moral turpitude;

16 2. Employs or permits any person who does not hold a license to practice veterinary medicine or to 17 practice as a licensed veterinary technician or registration to practice as an equine dental technician to 18 perform work which can lawfully be performed only by a person holding the appropriate license or 19 registration; 20

3. Willfully violates any provision of this chapter or any regulation of the Board;

21 4. Has violated any federal or state law relating to controlled substances as defined in Chapter 34 22 (§ 54.1-3400 et seq.) of this title; 23

5. Is guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by regulations of the Board;

24 6. Uses alcohol or drugs to the extent such use renders him unsafe to practice or suffers from any 25 mental or physical condition rendering him unsafe to practice; or

26 7. Has had his license to practice veterinary medicine or as a veterinary technician or his registration 27 to practice as an equine dental technician in any other state revoked or suspended. 28

§ 54.1-3813. Registration of equine dental technicians.

29 A. As used in this section, "equine dental technician" means an individual who satisfies the criteria 30 established by the Board for registration to perform duties relating to the care and maintenance of 31 equine teeth in accordance with this section and regulations promulgated by the Board. A licensed 32 veterinary technician shall practice in accordance with the requirements of § 54.1-3806 and regulations 33 of the Board governing the practice of licensed veterinary technicians.

34 B. The Board may register a person as an equine dental technician who meets the following criteria: 35 (i) satisfactory evidence that he is of good moral character, (ii) recommendations from at least two licensed veterinarians with practice bases that are at least 50 percent equine, and (iii) evidence that he 36 37 holds current certification from the International Association of Equine Dentistry or a Board-approved 38 certification program or has satisfactorily completed a Board-approved training program. The Board 39 may register individuals who have not completed a Board-approved training program or do not hold a 40 current certification from the International Association of Equine Dentistry or a Board-approved 41 certification program if they have engaged in acts considered to be those of an equine dental technician 42 as set forth in subsections C and D of this section for at least five years and provide the following: (i)43 satisfactory evidence of length of time of practice, (ii) recommendations from at least two licensed 44 veterinarians with practice bases that are at least 50 percent equine, and (iii) proof of continued 45 competency satisfactory to the Board.

46 C. It shall be unlawful for any person not holding a current and valid registration as an equine 47 dental technician or a current and valid license as a veterinarian to perform the following duties:

48 The planing or leveling of equine teeth using nonmotorized hand tools for routine dental 1. 49 maintenance:

50 2. The planing or leveling of equine teeth using motorized tools performed for routine dental maintenance, or the extraction of wolf teeth premolars including premolars 105, 205, 305 and 405, 51 52 performed under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian where (a) there exists an established 53 client-patient relationship between the veterinarian and the owner, (b) the veterinarian is present, and 54 (c) the veterinarian remains responsible for the sedation of the animal; and

55 3. Any other task restricted pursuant to regulations promulgated by the Board.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no equine dental technician shall administer any sedative, 56

57 *tranquilizer, analgesic, prescription medication, or other drug under any circumstances.*

58 D. The Board shall promulgate regulations in order to carry out the provisions of this section, which

59 shall include (i) criteria and fees for application and renewal; (ii) requirements for evidence of continued competency for equine dental technicians; and (ii) standards to ensure the health, safety, and

61 welfare of animals treated by equine dental technicians.

62 2. That practice as an equine dental technician in Virginia prior to the effective date of regulations

63 promulgated to implement § 54.1-3813 shall not constitute grounds for disciplinary action by the

64 Board of Veterinary Medicine. The Board may register a person who has practiced as an equine

65 dental technician in the Commonwealth upon application and compliance with the provisions of

66 this act.
