12	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 23 a chapter numbered 4.02, consisting
12	of sections numbered 23-38.10:8 through 23-38.10:14, as follows:
13 14	CHAPTER 4.02.
15	COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRANSFER GRANT PROGRAM.
16	§ 23-38.10:8. Definitions.
17	As used in this chapter:
18	"Council" means the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia.
19	"Grant" means the amount of financial assistance awarded under this chapter whether disbursed by
20	warrant directly to an institution of higher education or directly to a student.
21	"Institution of higher education" means a four-year public educational institution within the
22	Commonwealth whose primary purpose is to provide undergraduate collegiate education and not to
23	provide religious training or theological education.
24	"Student" means an undergraduate student who is entitled to in-state tuition charges pursuant to the
25	provisions of § 23-7.4.
26 27	§ 23-38.10:9. Community College Transfer Grant Program Fund established. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the
28	Community College Transfer Grant Program Fund, hereafter referred to as "the Fund." The Fund shall
2 9	be established on the books of the Comptroller and all funds appropriated by the General Assembly and
30	any gifts, grants, or donations from public or private sources shall be paid into the state treasury and
31	credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited
32	to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall
33	not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for
34	the purpose of providing higher education grants to domiciles of Virginia who have successfully
35	completed an acceptable associate degree program at a Virginia community college and have been
36	admitted to an accredited public institution of higher education in the Commonwealth. Expenditures and
37	disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the
38 39	Comptroller upon written request signed by the Director of the State Council of Higher Education for
39 40	Virginia. § 23-38.10:10. State Council of Higher Education designated as administering agency.
41	The State Council of Higher Education for Virginia is hereby designated as the administering agency
42	for the program established by this chapter and is authorized to promulgate regulations for the
43	disbursement of grants consistent therewith and appropriate to the administration of the program.
44	§ 23-38.10:11. Eligibility criteria.
45	A. Under this program, grants shall be made to or on behalf of eligible Virginia domiciles for the
46	academic year for which they enroll and are obligated to pay tuition as full-time undergraduate students
47	transferring from a Virginia community college as a junior, as specified in the relevant articulation
48	agreement between the community college and the institution of higher education, at an institution as
49 50	described in § 23-38.10:8. Only students who maintained a cumulative grade point average of at least
50 51	3.0 on a scale of 4.0 or its equivalent while enrolled in an associate degree program at a Virginia community college shall be eligible to receive a grant under this chapter.
51 52	B. Eligibility for a higher education grant under this program shall be limited to two academic years
52 53	or the equivalent number of credit hours and shall be used only for undergraduate collegiate work in
54	educational programs other than those providing religious training or theological education. Further,
55	students shall only be eligible to apply for a grant under this program for no more than one year
56	following receipt of an associate degree.
57	C. Individuals who have failed to meet the federal requirement to register for the Selective Service
58	shall not be eligible to receive grants pursuant to this chapter. However, a person who has failed to

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59 register for the Selective Service shall not be denied a right, privilege, or benefit under this section if (i)

60 the requirement to so register has terminated or become inapplicable to the person and (ii) the person 61 shows by a preponderance of the evidence that the failure to register was not a knowing and willful

62 failure to register.

63 § 23-38.10:12. Amount of award.

A. The amount of grants awarded under this chapter shall be based on the difference between the cost of tuition and educational and general fees paid by the recipient at a Virginia community college and the cost of such tuition and fees at the institution of higher education in which the student has been enrolled.

B. Each institution of higher education enrolling community college transfer grant recipients shall
receive an incentive grant of an amount specified in the appropriation act for each student enrolled who
receives a community college transfer grant under this section.

§ 23-38.10:13. Determination of domicile.

For the purposes of determining the eligibility of a student for a community college transfer grant,
domicile shall be determined by the enrolling institution, as provided in § 23-7.4, and the State Council
of Higher Education's guidelines for domiciliary status determinations.

75 § 23-38.10:14. Receipt by student of other financial aid.

76 Tuition assistance received by a student under this program shall not be reduced by the receipt of 77 other financial aid from any source by such student. However, a student shall not receive a grant 78 pursuant to this chapter that, when added to other financial aid received by that student, would enable

79 the student to receive total assistance in excess of the estimated cost to the student of attending the

80 *institution in which he is enrolled.*
