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11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 2.2-3708 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
13 14	2.2-3708. Electronic communication meetings.
14	A. It <i>Except as provided in subsection G, it</i> shall be a violation of this chapter for any political subdivision or any governing body, authority, board, bureau, commission, district or agency of local
16	government or any committee thereof to conduct a meeting wherein the public business is discussed or
17	transacted through telephonic, video, electronic or other communication means where the members are
18	not physically assembled. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the use of interactive
19 20	audio or video means to expand public participation. B. For purposes of this section:
21	"Electronic communication means" means any audio or combined audio and visual communication
22	method.
23 24	"Public body" means any public body of the Commonwealth, but excludes any political subdivision
24 25	or any governing body, authority, board, bureau, commission, district or agency of local government. Except as provided in subsection D of § 2.2-3707.01, state public bodies may conduct any meeting
26	wherein the public business is discussed or transacted through electronic communication means. Where a
27	quorum of a public body of the Commonwealth is physically assembled at one location for the purpose
28 29	of conducting a meeting authorized under this section, additional members of such public body may
29 30	participate in the meeting through electronic communication means provided such participation is available to the public.
31	If a public body holds an electronic meeting pursuant to this section, the public body shall also hold
32	at least one meeting annually where members in attendance at the meeting are physically assembled at
33 34	one location and where no members participate by electronic communication means. C. Notice of any meetings held pursuant to this section shall be provided at least seven working days
35	in advance of the date scheduled for the meeting. The notice shall include the date, time, place, and
36	purpose for the meeting; shall identify the locations for the meeting; and shall include a telephone
37	number that may be used at remote locations to notify the primary or central meeting location of any
38 39	interruption in the telephonic or video broadcast of the meeting to the remote locations. All locations for the meeting shall be made accessible to the public. All persons attending the meeting at any of the
40	meeting locations shall be afforded the same opportunity to address the public body as persons attending
41	the primary or central location. Any interruption in the telephonic or video broadcast of the meeting
42	shall result in the suspension of action at the meeting until repairs are made and public access restored.
43 44	Seven working days' notice shall not be required for meetings authorized under this section continued to address an emergency as provided in subsection F or to conclude the agenda of a meeting authorized
45	under this section for which the proper notice has been given, when the date, time, place, and purpose
46	of the continued meeting are set during the meeting prior to adjournment.
47	D. An agenda and materials that will be distributed to members of the public body and that have
48 49	been made available to the staff of the public body in sufficient time for duplication and forwarding to all locations where public access will be provided shall be made available to the public at the time of
5 0	the meeting. Minutes of all meetings held by electronic communication means shall be recorded as
51	required by § 2.2-3707. Votes taken during any meeting conducted through electronic communication
52 52	means shall be recorded by name in roll-call fashion and included in the minutes.
53 54	E. Any public body that meets by electronic communication means shall make a written report of the following to the Virginia Freedom of Information Advisory Council and the Joint Commission on
55	Technology and Science by December 15 of each year:
56	1. The total number of electronic communication meetings held during the preceding year;
57 59	2. The dates and purposes of the meetings;
58	3. The number of sites for each meeting;

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59 4. The types of electronic communication means by which the meetings were held;

60 5. The number of participants, including members of the public, at each meeting location;

61 6. The identity of the members of the public body recorded as absent, and those recorded as present 62 at each meeting location;

63 7. A summary of any public comment received about the electronic communication meetings; and

64 8. A written summary of the public body's experience using electronic communication meetings, 65 including its logistical and technical experience.

F. A public body may meet by electronic communication means as often as needed if an emergency 66 exists and the public body is unable to meet in regular session. Public bodies conducting emergency 67 meetings through electronic communication means shall comply with the provisions of subsection D **68** requiring minutes of the meeting. The nature of the emergency shall be stated in the minutes. 69

70 G. A local governing body may meet by electronic communication means when a local state of emergency has been declared in accordance with § 44-146.21 provided (i) the meeting is necessary to 71 take action to address the emergency, (ii) notice, reasonable under the circumstances, of the emergency 72 meeting shall be given contemporaneously with the notice provided members of the local governing body 73 conducting the meeting, (iii) the local governing body makes arrangements for public participation, and 74

(iv) the local governing body otherwise complies with the provisions of this section. 75
