Patron—Lewis 6 7 Referred to Committee on Counties, Cities and Towns 8 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 10 1. 11 **CHARTER** 12 FOR THE 13 TOWN OF CHERITON. 14 CHAPTER 1. 15 INCORPORATION AND BOUNDARIES. 16 § 1.1. Incorporation. The inhabitants of the territory comprised within the present limits of the Town of Cheriton, as such 17 limits are now or may hereafter be altered and established by law, shall constitute and continue a body 18 politic and corporate, to be known and designated as the Town of Cheriton, and as such shall have 19 20 perpetual succession, may sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, contract and be contracted with, 21 and may have a corporate seal that it may alter, renew or amend at its pleasure by proper ordinance. 22 § 1.2. Boundaries. 23 The territory embraced within the Town of Cheriton is that territory in the County of Northampton, Virginia, established by order of the Circuit Court of Northampton County, April 3, 1951, as found in 24 25 the Common Law Order Book 18, page 11, and that territory added by boundary adjustment as 26 described in the minute book of the Northampton County Board of Supervisors. 27 CHAPTER 2. 28 POWERS. 29 § 2.1. General Grant of Powers. 30 The Town of Cheriton shall have and may exercise all powers that are now or hereafter may be 31 conferred upon or delegated to towns under the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, as fully and completely as though such powers were specifically enumerated herein, and no enumeration 32 33 of particular powers by this Charter shall be held to be exclusive, and the town shall have, exercise and 34 enjoy all the rights, immunities, powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and obligations, 35 now appertaining to and incumbent on the town as a municipal corporation. § 2.2. Adoption of Certain Sections of the Code of Virginia. 36 37 The powers set forth in §§ 15.2-1100 through 15.2-1126, both inclusive, of Chapter 11 of Title 15.2 38 of the Code of Virginia, as in force on January one, two thousand seven, and as may hereafter be amended, are hereby conferred on and vested in the town. 39 40 § 2.3. Eminent Domain. 41 The powers of eminent domain set forth in Title 15.2, Chapter 2 of Title 25.1, and § 33.1-121 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, and all acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, mutatis 42 mutandis, are hereby conferred upon the Town. 43 44 (a) In any case in which a petition for condemnation is filed by or on behalf of the town, a true copy of a resolution or ordinance duly adopted by the town council declaring the necessity for any 45 46 taking or damaging of any property, within or without the town, for the public purposes of the town, 47 shall be filed with the petition. The town may employ the procedures conferred by the foregoing laws, 48 mutatis mutandis, and may, in addition thereto, proceed as hereinafter provided. 49 (b) Certificates issued pursuant to § 33.1-121 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, and acts 50 amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, may be issued by the town council, signed by the mayor 51 and countersigned by the town treasurer. Such certificate shall have the same effect as certificates 52 issued by the State Highway Commissioner, under the aforesaid laws, and may be issued in any case in 53 which the town proposes to acquire property of any kind by the exercise of its powers of eminent 54 domain for streets, water, sewers, and related matters, whether within or without the town.

(c) In addition to the powers conferred by the aforesaid laws, such certificates may be amended or
cancelled by the court having jurisdiction of the proceedings, upon petition of the town, at any time
after the filing thereof; provided, that the court shall have jurisdiction to make such order for the
payment of costs and damages, if any, or the refund of any excessive sums theretofore paid pursuant to

59 such certificate as shall, upon due notice and hearing, appear just. The court shall have jurisdiction to 60 require refunding bonds, for good cause shown by the town or any other person or party in interest, 61 prior to authorizing any distribution of funds pursuant to any certificate issued or deposit made by the 62 town

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#### CHAPTER 3.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL.

§ 3.1. Election, Qualification and Term of Office of Councilmen and Mayor.

(a) The Town of Cheriton shall be governed by a town council composed of six councilmen and a 66 mayor, all of whom shall be qualified voters of the town to be elected from the town at large. 67

(b) The mayor and councilmen in office at the time of the passage of this act shall continue in office **68** until their successors are elected and qualified. An election for mayor and councilmen shall be held on the first Tuesday in May, in two thousand eight, and on the first Tuesday in May of every 69 70 71 even-numbered year thereafter. The council members and mayor so elected shall take office on the first day of the following July, and shall each serve until their successors are elected and have qualified. 72

73 (c) No mayor or member of Council shall be an employee of the Town and upon the qualification of 74 any such person for such position, his employment with the Town shall cease. 75

§ 3.2. Vacancies on Council.

Vacancies on the council shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by a majority vote of 76 77 the members of the council; persons so elected to fill vacancies must be qualified voters of the town.

78 If any member of the council shall be voluntarily absent from three regular meetings of the council 79 consecutively, his seat may be deemed vacant by resolution of the council and thereupon his unexpired 80 term shall be filled according to the provisions of this act. 81

§ 3.3. Vacancies in Office of Mayor.

A vacancy in the office of mayor shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term by a majority 82 83 vote of the members of the council; the person so elected to fill the vacancy must be a qualified voter of 84 the town. 85

§ 3.4. Council a Continuing Body.

86 The town council shall be a continuing body, and no measures pending before such body or any 87 contract or obligation incurred, shall abate or be discontinued by reasons of the expiration of the term 88 of office or removal of any of its members. 89

§ 3.5. Powers and Duties of Mayor.

90 The mayor shall be the chief executive officer of the town. He shall have and exercise all power and 91 authority conferred by general law not inconsistent with this Charter. He shall preside over the meetings 92 of the town council and shall have the same right to speak therein as members of the council, but shall not vote except in the case of a tie vote. He shall have the power of veto over the ordinances and 93 resolutions of the council, but such ordinances and resolutions may be passed over such veto by a 94 95 two-thirds vote of the members of the town council present and voting. He shall be recognized as the head of the town government for all ceremonial purposes. He shall perform such other duties consistent 96 97 with his office as may be imposed by the town council. He shall see that the duties of the various town 98 officers are faithfully performed. He, or the person acting as mayor, may deputize such assistant 99 policemen as may be necessary; shall authenticate by his signature such documents or instruments as 100 the council, this Charter, or the laws of the Commonwealth shall require. 101

§ 3.6. Vice Mayor.

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102 The town council shall elect from its members, by a majority of the members present, a vice mayor. 103 During the absence or inability of the mayor to act, the vice mayor shall possess the powers and discharge the duties of the mayor. While serving in the place of the mayor, the vice mayor may vote as 104 105 a member of the town council.

§ 3.7. Meetings of Council.

107 The town council shall fix the time of their stated meetings and they shall meet at least once a 108 month. A journal shall be kept of its official proceedings and its meetings shall be open to the public. 109 Four members of the town council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting. Special meetings may be called at any time by the mayor or by any three members of the 110 111 council; provided that the mayor and all council members are duly notified in writing a reasonable period of time prior to such meeting, and no business shall be transacted at a special meeting thereof, 112 113 except that for which it shall be called. If all members are present, this provision may be waived by a 114 majority vote of the council. 115

§ 3.8. Council to Fix Salaries.

The town council is hereby authorized to fix the salary of the mayor, members of the town council, 116 the town manager, members of boards or commissions, and all appointed officers and employees of said 117 118 town, at a sum not to exceed any limitations placed thereon by the laws of the Commonwealth of 119 Virginia.

120 § 3.9. Acting Mayor.

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121 In the absence or inability to act of both the mayor and vice mayor, any member of the town council 122 may act with all the powers of the mayor upon the request so to do by the town council, but only 123 during the period of such dual absence and inability.

124 § 3.10. General Grant of Powers to Council.

125 The town council shall have all powers and authority that are now or may hereafter be granted to 126 councils of towns by the general laws of the Commonwealth and by this Charter, and the recital of 127 special powers and authorities herein shall not be taken to exclude the exercise of any power and 128 authority granted by the general laws of the Commonwealth to town councils, but not herein specified. CHAPTER 4.

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#### APPOINTIVE OFFICERS.

§ 4.1. Appointment.

132 The town council may appoint such officers of the town as they deem necessary. Such officers may 133 include, but shall not be limited to, a town manager, a town clerk, a town attorney, a town treasurer, 134 Chief of Police and special police officers. The enumeration of officers in this section shall not be 135 construed to require the appointment of any of such officers herein named. Officers appointed by the town council shall perform such duties as may be specified in this Charter, by the laws of the 136 137 Commonwealth, or by the town council.

138 § 4.2. Deputies and Assistants.

139 The town council may appoint such deputies and assistants to appointive offices as the town council **140** may deem necessary.

141 § 4.3. Term of Office.

142 Officers and deputies and assistant officers appointed by the town council shall serve at the will and 143 pleasure of the town council. 144

§ 4.4. Appointment of one person to more than one office.

145 The town council may appoint the same person to more than one appointive office, at the discretion 146 of the town council subject to such limitations as are set forth in the Constitution of Virginia and Title 147 15.2 of the Code of Virginia, as amended from time to time.

148 § 4.5. Qualifications and Duties of the Town Manager.

149 The town manager shall be the executive officer of the town, and shall be responsible to the town council for the proper administration of the town government. It shall be the duty of the town manager 150 151 to: 152

(a) Attend all meetings of the town council, with the right to speak but not to vote.

153 (b) Keep the town council advised of the financial condition and the future needs of the town and of 154 all matters pertaining to its proper administration, and make such recommendations as may seem to him 155 desirable.

156 (c) Prepare and submit the annual budget of the town council and be responsible for its 157 administration after its adoption.

158 (d) Prepare in suitable form for publication and submit to the town council at the next regular meeting following the end of each fiscal year, a concise, comprehensive report of the financial transactions and administrative activities of the town government during the immediately preceding 159 160 161 fiscal year.

162 (e) Present adequate financial and activity reports as required by the town council.

163 (f) Arrange for an annual audit by a certified public accountant, the selection of whom shall be 164 approved by the town council.

165 (g) Perform such other duties as may be prescribed by this Charter, or required of him in 166 accordance therewith by the town council, or which may be required by the chief executive officer of a 167 town by the general laws of the Commonwealth.

168 All employees of the town, except those appointed by the town council pursuant to this Charter or 169 the general laws of the Commonwealth, shall be appointed and may be removed by the town manager, 170 who shall report each appointment or removal to the town council at the next meeting thereof following 171 any such appointment or removal. The town council shall designate by ordinance a person to act as 172 town manager in the case of the absence, incapacity, death or resignation of the town manager, until 173 his return to duty or the appointment of his successor. Until such time as the town council appoints any 174 such town manager the duties and powers outlined herein shall be given to the mayor, or such other 175 person as may be designated by the town council. All employees and officers of the town, including 176 those appointed by the town council, shall be under the management control and supervision of the 177 town manager.

178 § 4.6. Duties of the Town Clerk.

179 The town clerk shall be the clerk of the town council. He shall keep the journal of the proceedings 180 and shall record all ordinances and resolutions in a book or books kept for the purpose. He shall be the 181 custodian of the corporate seal of the town and shall be the officer authorized to use and authenticate 185

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it. He shall perform such other duties and keep such other records as the town council may specify or 182 183 the general laws of the Commonwealth require of town clerks. All records in his office shall be public records and open to inspection at any time during regular business hours. 184

§ 4.7. Duties of the Town Attorney.

186 The town attorney shall be the legal adviser of the town council. He shall represent the town in all legal affairs as may be requested by the mayor, town council, or by an officer of the town appointed 187 188 under the provisions of this Charter.

189 § 4.8. Duties of the Town Treasurer.

190 The town treasurer shall collect the town taxes and licenses, and shall have the power to levy and 191 sell for collection as given to county treasurers. The town treasurer shall work cooperatively with the 192 Town Manager to provide full financial disclosure and reporting as requested by the Town Council. The town treasurer shall perform such other duties, not inconsistent with his office, as the Town Council or 193 194 Town Manager may direct.

195 § 4.9. Powers and Duties of the Chief of Police and Special Policemen.

196 The Chief of Police shall be a conservator of the peace, and vested with the full powers of a 197 constable within the limits of the town. He, and any special police officers who may be appointed by the 198 mayor with the advice and consent of a majority of the members of the town council, shall have all the 199 powers given to special police officers under the laws of the Commonwealth. The police force of the 200 town shall be under the control of the Chief of Police for the purpose of enforcing peace and good 201 order and executing the laws of the State and all the ordinances of the town. He shall assist the 202 treasurer in the collection of town taxes, and may distrain and sell therefor in like manner for which 203 State taxes and county levies are distrained. 204

§ 4.10. Bonds.

205 Officers, deputies and assistants appointed by the town council shall execute such bonds as may be required by resolution of the town council. 206

§ 4.11. Vacancies in Office. 207

The town council may fill any vacancy in any appointive office. 208

209 § 4.12. Residence of Officers and Employees.

210 Any appointive officers or employees of the town may be appointed and serve whether or not the 211 appointee be a resident or nonresident of the town. 212

# CHAPTER 5.

### RAISING OF REVENUE.

§ 5.1. Assessment of Taxes.

215 The council shall have the power to assess and tax real or personal property within the town, levy taxes, impose licenses and collect the same to any extent not prohibited by laws of the Commonwealth. 216 217

§ 5.2. Other Revenue-Generating Activity.

218 The town council shall have the power to engage in other revenue-generating activities to any extent 219 not prohibited by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia. 220

#### CHAPTER 6.

# FINANCIAL PROVISIONS.

§ 6.1. Fiscal Year.

The fiscal year of the town shall begin on July one of each year, and end on June thirtieth of the *vear following.* 

## CHAPTER 7.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

§ 7.1. Elections Governed by State Law.

228 All town elections shall be held and conducted in the manner prescribed by the laws of the 229 Commonwealth of Virginia. 230

§ 7.2. Applicability Outside Town.

231 All ordinances of the town so far as they are applicable, shall apply on, in or to all land, buildings 232 and structures owned by or leased or rented to the town and located outside the town. 233

§ 7.3. Present Officers to Continue.

The present elected officers of the town shall be and remain in office until expiration of their several terms, and until their successors have been duly elected and qualified.

§ 7.4. Ordinances Continued in Force.

237 All ordinances now in force in the town of Cheriton, not inconsistent with this Charter, shall be and 238 remain in force until altered, amended or repealed by the town council. 239

§ 7.5. Severability of Provisions.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this Charter shall for any reason be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the 240 241 remainder of this Charter, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph or 242 part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered. 243

244 245 246 § 7.6. Disclosure of Interest. The town council is hereby empowered to adopt a conflict of interest and disclosure ordinance to govern elected and/or appointed town officials not inconsistent with the general law.
