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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11 12	1. That §§ 46.2-342 and 46.2-345 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows:
12 13	§ 46.2-342. What license to contain; organ donor information; Uniform Donor Document.
13 14	A. Every license issued under this chapter shall bear: 1. For licenses issued or renewed on or after July 1, 2003, a license number which shall be assigned
15	by the Department to the licensee and shall not be the same as the licensee's social security number;
16	2. A color photograph of the licensee;
17	3. The licensee's full name, year, month, and date of birth;
18	4. The licensee's address, subject to the provisions of subsection A1 of this section;
19	5. A brief description of the licensee for the purpose of identification;
20	6. A space for the signature of the licensee; and
21	7. Any other information deemed necessary by the Commissioner for the administration of this title.
22	No abbreviated names or nicknames shall be shown on any license.
23	A1. At the option of the licensee, the address shown on the license may be either the post office
24	box, business, or residence address of the licensee, provided such address is located in Virginia.
25	However, regardless of which address is shown on the license, the licensee shall supply the Department
26	with his residence address, which shall be an address in Virginia. This residence address shall be
27	maintained in the Department's records. Whenever the licensee's address shown either on his license or
28 29	in the Department's records changes, he shall notify the Department of such change as required by § 46.2-324.
29 30	B. The license shall be made of a material and in a form to be determined by the Commissioner.
31	C. Licenses issued to persons less than 21 years old shall be immediately and readily distinguishable
32	from those issued to persons 21 years old or older. Distinguishing characteristics shall include unique
33	design elements of the document and descriptors within the photograph area to identify persons who are
34	at least 15 years old but less than 21 years old. These descriptors shall include the month, day, and year
35	when the person will become 21 years old.
36	D. The Department shall establish a method by which an applicant for a driver's license or an
37	identification card may designate his willingness to be an organ donor as provided in Article 2
38	(§ 32.1-289 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 32.1 and shall cooperate with the Virginia Transplant Council
	to ensure that such method is designed to encourage organ donation with a minimum of effort on the
40	part of the donor and the Department.
41	E. If an applicant designates his willingness to be a donor pursuant to subsection D, the Department
42 43	may make a notation of this designation on his license or card and shall make a notation of this designation in his driver record
43 44	designation in his driver record. F. The donor designation authorized in subsection E shall be sufficient legal authority for the
45	removal, following death, of the subject's organs or tissues without additional authority from the donor,
46	or his family or estate. No family member, guardian, agent named pursuant to an advance directive or
47	person responsible for the decedent's estate shall refuse to honor the donor designation or, in any way,
48	seek to avoid honoring the donor designation.
49	G. The donor designation provided pursuant to subsection D may be rescinded by notifying the
50	Department.
51	H. With the written consent of his parent or legal guardian, a minor may make a donor designation.
52	I. When requested by the applicant, and upon presentation of a signed statement by a licensed
53	physician confirming the applicant's condition, the Department shall indicate on the applicant's driver's
54	license that the applicant is (i) an insulin-dependent diabetic, or (ii) hearing or speech impaired.
55	J. When requested by the applicant, the Department shall indicate on the applicant's driver's license
56	the names of no more than five persons to be identified as "emergency contact persons." Contact
57 59	information pertaining to such "emergency contact persons," such as addresses and telephone numbers,
58	as supplied by the applicant, shall be maintained by the Department and released to law-enforcement

59 and other emergency services personnel as provided in regulations promulgated by the Commissioner.

60 K. In the absence of gross negligence or willful misconduct, the Department and its employees shall be immune from any civil or criminal liability in connection with the making of or failure to make a 61 62 notation of donor designation on any license or card or in any person's driver record.

63 K.L. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, the Department shall continue to use 64 the uniform donor document, as formerly set forth in subsection D above, for organ donation 65 designation until such time as a new method is fully implemented, which shall be no later than July 1, 1994. Any such uniform donor document shall, when properly executed, remain valid and shall continue 66 to be subject to all conditions for execution, delivery, amendment, and revocation as set out in Article 2 67 68 (§ 32.1-289 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 32.1.

L-M. The Department shall, in coordination with the Virginia Transplant Council, prepare an organ 69 donor information brochure describing the organ donor program and providing instructions for 70 completion of the uniform donor document information describing the bone marrow donation program 71 and instructions for registration in the National Bone Marrow Registry. The Department shall include a 72 73 copy of such brochure with every driver's license renewal notice or application mailed to licensed 74 drivers in Virginia. 75

§ 46.2-345. Issuance of special identification cards; fee; confidentiality; penalties.

A. On the application of any person who is a resident of the Commonwealth or the parent or legal 76 77 guardian of any such person who is under the age of 15, the Department shall issue a special identification card to the person provided: 78

79 1. Application is made on a form prescribed by the Department and includes the applicant's full legal name; year, month, and date of birth; sex; and residence address; 80

2. The applicant presents a birth certificate or other evidence acceptable to the Department of his 81 82 name and date of birth:

83 3. The Department is satisfied that the applicant needs an identification card or the applicant shows 84 he has a bona fide need for such a card; and

85 4. The applicant does not hold a driver's license, commercial driver's license, temporary driver's 86 permit, learner's permit, or motorcycle learner's permit.

87 When requested by the applicant, the Department shall indicate on the applicant's special identification card the names of no more than five persons to be identified as "emergency contact 88 89 persons" for the applicant. Contact information pertaining to such "emergency contact persons," such as 90 addresses and telephone numbers, as supplied by the applicant, shall be maintained by the Department 91 and released to law-enforcement and other emergency services personnel as provided in regulations 92 promulgated by the Commissioner.

93 Persons 70 years of age or older may exchange a valid Virginia driver's license for a special identification card at no fee. Special identification cards subsequently issued to such persons shall be 94 95 subject to the regular fees for special identification cards.

B. The fee for the issuance of an original or renewal special identification card is \$5. The fee for the 96 97 issuance of a duplicate or reissue of a special identification card is \$5. Persons 21 years old or older 98 may be issued a scenic special identification card for an additional fee of \$5.

99 C. Every special identification card shall expire on the last day of the month of birth of the applicant 100 in years in which the applicant attains an age exactly divisible by five. At no time shall any special 101 identification card be issued for less than three nor more than seven years, except under the provisions of subsection B of § 46.2-328.1 and except that those cards issued to children under the age of 15 shall 102 103 expire on the child's sixteenth birthday, thereafter the special identification card may be renewed on or before the last day of the month of birth of the applicant and shall be valid for five years, expiring in 104 105 the next year in which the applicant's age is exactly divisible by five, except under the provisions of 106 subsection B of § 46.2-328.1.

107 D. A special identification card issued under this section may be similar in size, shape, and design to a driver's license, and include a color photograph of its holder, but the card shall be readily distinguishable from a driver's license and shall clearly state that it does not authorize the person to 108 109 110 whom it is issued to drive a motor vehicle.

111 E. Special identification cards, for persons at least 15 years old but less than 21 years old, shall be immediately and readily distinguishable from those issued to persons 21 years old or older. 112 113 Distinguishing characteristics shall include unique design elements of the document and descriptors within the photograph area to identify persons who are at least 15 years old but less than 21 years old. 114 These descriptors shall include the month, day, and year when the person will become 21 years old. 115

F. Special identification cards for persons under age 15 shall bear a full face photograph. The special 116 identification card issued to persons under age 15 shall be readily distinguishable from a driver's license 117 and from other special identification cards issued by the Department. Such cards shall clearly indicate 118 119 that it does not authorize the person to whom it is issued to drive a motor vehicle.

G. A valid Virginia driver's license may be surrendered for a special identification card without the 120

applicant's having to present proof of legal presence as required by § 46.2-328.1 if the Virginia driver's license is unexpired and it has not been revoked, suspended, or cancelled. The special identification card shall be considered a reissue and the expiration date shall be the last day of the month of the surrendered driver's license's month of expiration.

H. Any personal information, as identified in § 2.2-3801, which is retained by the Department from an application for the issuance of a special identification card is confidential and shall not be divulged to any person, association, corporation, or organization, public or private, except to the legal guardian or the attorney of the applicant or to a person, association, corporation, or organization nominated in writing by the applicant, his legal guardian, or his attorney. This subsection shall not prevent the Department from furnishing the application or any information thereon to any law-enforcement agency.

131 I. Any person who uses a false or fictitious name or gives a false or fictitious address in any 132 application for an identification card or knowingly makes a false statement or conceals a material fact or 133 otherwise commits a fraud in any such application shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor. However, 134 where the name or address is given, or false statement is made, or fact is concealed, or fraud committed, 135 with the intent to purchase a firearm or where the identification card is obtained for the purpose of 136 committing any offense punishable as a felony, a violation of this section shall constitute a Class 4 137 felony.

I. The Department may promulgate regulations necessary for the effective implementation of the provisions of this section.

140 K. The Department shall utilize the various communications media throughout the Commonwealth to141 inform Virginia residents of the provisions of this section and to promote and encourage the public to142 take advantage of its provisions.

143 L. (Effective January 1, 2007) The Department shall electronically transmit application information to 144 the Department of State Police, in a format approved by the State Police, for comparison with 145 information contained in the Virginia Criminal Information Network and National Crime Information 146 Center Convicted Sexual Offender Registry Files, at the time of issuance of a special identification card. 147 Whenever it appears from the records of the State Police that a person has failed to comply with the 148 duty to register or reregister pursuant to Chapter 9 (§ 9.1-900 et seq.) of Title 9.1, the State Police shall 149 promptly investigate and, if there is probable cause to believe a violation has occurred, obtain a warrant 150 or assist in obtaining an indictment charging a violation of § 18.2-472.1 in the jurisdiction in which the 151 person made application for the special identification card.
