A person shall be guilty of a Class 2 I misdemeanor if he makes, causes to be made or conspires 14 to make directly, indirectly or through an agency, any materially false statement in writing, knowing it 15 to be false and intending that it be relied upon, concerning the financial condition or means or ability to 16 pay of himself, or of any other person for whom he is acting, or any firm or corporation in which he is interested or for which he is acting, for the purpose of procuring, for his own benefit or for the benefit 17 of such person, firm or corporation, the delivery of personal property, the payment of cash, the making 18 of a loan or credit, the extension of a credit, the discount of an account receivable, or the making, 19 20 acceptance, discount, sale or endorsement of a bill of exchange or promissory note. 21 **B**. Any person who knows that a false statement has been made in writing concerning the financial 22 condition or ability to pay of himself or of any person for whom he is acting, or any firm or corporation 23 in which he is interested or for which he is acting and who, with intent to defraud, procures, upon the faith thereof, for his own benefit, or for the benefit of the person, firm or corporation in which he is 24 interested or for which he is acting, any such delivery, payment, loan, credit, extension, discount 25 26 making, acceptance, sale or endorsement, and fails to pay for such loan, credit or benefit so procured, 27 shall, if the value of the thing or the amount of the loan, credit or benefit obtained is \$200 or more, be 28 guilty of grand larceny or, if the value is less than \$200, be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor petit 29 larcenv. 30 C. Venue for the trial of any person charged with an offense under this section may be in the county 31 or city in which (i) any act was performed in furtherance of the offense, or (ii) the person charged with the offense resided at the time of the offense. 32 D.
