

## 1 VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY — CHAPTER

2 *An Act to amend and reenact § 44-102.2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to Virginia Military Family*  
3 *Relief Fund; assistance after active duty.*

6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 44-102.2 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**

8 § 44-102.2. Virginia Military Family Relief Fund established.

9 A. There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the  
10 Virginia Military Family Relief Fund (the Fund). The Fund shall be established on the books of the  
11 Comptroller and administered by the Office of the Adjutant General for the purposes set forth herein.  
12 All moneys as may be appropriated by the General Assembly, private gifts, grants, or donations  
13 contributed to the Fund, and revenues received by the Commonwealth for the Fund pursuant to  
14 § 58.1-344.3 shall be paid into the state treasury and credited to the Fund. Interest earned on moneys in  
15 the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including  
16 interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the  
17 Fund. Moneys in the Fund shall be used solely for the purposes of assisting members of the Virginia  
18 National Guard and Virginia residents who are members of the reserves of the armed forces of the  
19 United States who have been called to extended active duty for periods in excess of 90 days, and their  
20 families, with living expenses including, but not limited to food, housing, utilities, and medical services.  
21 *Assistance may be provided from the Fund from the date of entry into active duty until 180 days after*  
22 *release from active duty.* Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State  
23 Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the Adjutant General.

24 B. The Adjutant General shall submit an annual report to the Governor and the chairmen of the  
25 House Appropriations Committee and the Senate Committee on Finance of the General Assembly. The  
26 report shall detail:

27 1. The expenditures of the Fund, including the amount of awards provided from the Fund to each  
28 branch of service, the amount of individual and family assistance provided, the qualifications of the  
29 recipients, and the balance available in the Fund for future disbursements; and

30 2. The name, address, rank, branch of service, deployment location, and amount of financial  
31 assistance provided to each recipient. The information provided under this subdivision that identifies a  
32 recipient or members of the recipient's family or the deployment location of any member of the Virginia  
33 National Guard or the reserves of the armed forces of the United States shall be confidential and shall  
34 not be subject to public disclosure.
