| 9          | Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:   |
| 10         | 1. That § 8.01-328.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:  |
| 11         | § 8.01-328.1. When personal jurisdiction over person may be exercised.   |
| 12         | A. A court may exercise personal jurisdiction over a person, who acts directly or by an agent, as to a   |
| 13         | cause of action arising from the person's:   |
| 14         | 1. Transacting any business in this Commonwealth;  |
| 15         | 2. Contracting to supply services or things in this Commonwealth;  |
| 16         | 3. Causing tortious injury by an act or omission in this Commonwealth;   |
| 17         | 4. Causing tortious injury in this Commonwealth by an act or omission outside this Commonwealth  |
| 18         | if he regularly does or solicits business, or engages in any other persistent course of conduct, or derives  |
| 19         | substantial revenue from goods used or consumed or services rendered, in this Commonwealth;  |
| 20         | 5. Causing injury in this Commonwealth to any person by breach of warranty expressly or impliedly  |
| 21         | made in the sale of goods outside this Commonwealth when he might reasonably have expected such  |
| 22<br>23   | person to use, consume, or be affected by the goods in this Commonwealth, provided that he also  |
| 23<br>24   | regularly does or solicits business, or engages in any other persistent course of conduct, or derives substantial revenue from goods used or consumed or services rendered in this Commonwealth; |
| 25         | 6. Having an interest in, using, or possessing real property in this Commonwealth;   |
| <b>2</b> 6 | 7. Contracting to insure any person, property, or risk located within this Commonwealth at the time  |
| 27         | of contracting;  |
| 28         | 8. Having (i) executed an agreement in this Commonwealth which obligates the person to pay   |
| 29         | spousal support or child support to a domiciliary of this Commonwealth, or to a person who has   |
| 30         | satisfied the residency requirements in suits for annulments or divorce for members of the armed forces  |
| 31         | pursuant to § 20-97 provided proof of service of process on a nonresident party is made by a   |
| 32         | law-enforcement officer or other person authorized to serve process in the jurisdiction where the  |
| 33         | nonresident party is located, (ii) been ordered to pay spousal support or child support pursuant to an   |
| 34         | order entered by any court of competent jurisdiction in this Commonwealth having in personam   |
| 35         | jurisdiction over such person, or (iii) shown by personal conduct in this Commonwealth, as alleged by  |
| 36         | affidavit, that the person conceived or fathered a child in this Commonwealth;   |
| 37         | 9. Having maintained within this Commonwealth a matrimonial domicile at the time of separation of  |
| 38<br>39   | the parties upon which grounds for divorce or separate maintenance is based, or at the time a cause of   |
| <b>40</b>  | action arose for divorce or separate maintenance or at the time of commencement of such suit, if the other party to the matrimonial relationship resides herein; or                              |
| 40         | 10. Having incurred a tangible personal property tax liability for taxes, fines, penalties, interest, or   |
| 42         | other charges to any political subdivision of the Commonwealth.  |
| 43         | Jurisdiction in subdivision 9 is valid only upon proof of service of process pursuant to § 8.01-296 on   |
| 44         | the nonresident party by a person authorized under the provisions of § 8.01-320. Jurisdiction under  |
| 45         | subdivision 8 (iii) of this subsection is valid only upon proof of personal service on a nonresident   |
| 46         | pursuant to § 8.01-320.  |
| 47         | B. Using a computer or computer network located in the Commonwealth shall constitute an act in   |
| <b>48</b>  | the Commonwealth. For purposes of this subsection, "use" and "computer network" shall have the same  |
| <b>49</b>  | meanings as those contained in § 18.2-152.2.   |
| 50         | C. When jurisdiction over a person is based solely upon this section, only a cause of action arising   |
| 51         | from acts enumerated in this section may be asserted against him; however, nothing contained in this   |
| 52         | chapter shall limit, restrict or otherwise affect the jurisdiction of any court of this Commonwealth over  |
| 53         | foreign corporations which are subject to service of process pursuant to the provisions of any other   |
| 54         | statute.   |
