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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That §§ 54.1-1140, 54.1-1142, and 54.1-1143 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted
12	and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 54.1-1140.1 as follows:
13	§ 54.1-1140. Definitions.
14	As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:
15	"Certified elevator mechanic" means an individual who is certified by the Board in accordance with
16	this article to engage in work as an elevator mechanic.
17	"Elevator mechanic" means an individual who is certified by the Board in accordance with this
18	article who is engaged in erecting, constructing, installing, altering, servicing, repairing, testing or
19	maintaining elevators, escalators, or related conveyances in accordance with the Uniform Statewide
20	Building Code. However, a person not certified as an elevator mechanic may perform maintenance that
21	is not related to the operating integrity of an elevator, escalator, or related conveyance, as provided in
22	the regulations of the Board.
23	§ 54.1-1140.1. Applicability.
24	The certification program established under this article shall be voluntary and shall not be construed
25	to restrict or otherwise affect the right of any uncertified person to engage in activity as an elevator
26	mechanic; however, no person may hold himself out as, or use the title of, "certified elevator mechanic"
27	unless he has been so certified pursuant to the provisions of this article.
28	§ 54.1-1142. Issuance of certification.
29 20	A. The Board shall issue a certificate to practice as an <i>a certified</i> elevator mechanic in the
30 31	Commonwealth to any applicant who has submitted satisfactory evidence that he has successfully: 1. Completed the educational requirements as required by the Board, which shall at a minimum
31 32	include such requirements as the Board determines will establish minimum competency on the part of
32 33	the applicant;
33 34	2. Completed the experience requirements as required by the Board, which shall at a minimum
35	consist of at least three years in the elevator industry; and
36	3. Passed an examination offered or approved by the Board.
37	B. The Board may issue a certificate to practice as a certified elevator mechanic to any applicant
38	who has a certification from an association approved by the Board that is equal to or exceeds the
39	requirements established by the Board for all applicants.
40	C. Any individual who applies for certification as an <i>a certified</i> elevator mechanic between July 1,
41	2004, and July 1, 2005, shall be deemed to have fulfilled the examination requirement if he is able to
42	demonstrate that he has at least five years experience as an elevator mechanic.
43	§ 54.1-1143. Continuing education.
44	A. The Board shall establish in the regulations requirements for continuing education as a
45	prerequisite to renewal of any certificate issued under this article. The Board shall require evidence of
46	knowledge of the Uniform Statewide Building Code changes as a prerequisite to renewal of any
47	certificate issued under this article. In addition, the Board may require continuing education for any
48	individual who is found to be in violation of law or regulations governing the practice of an elevator
49	mechanic certified under this article.
50	B. AnA certified elevator mechanic, as a condition of recertification and as part of the recertification
51	application, shall certify to the Board that he has completed at least eight hours of continuing education,
52	approved by the Board, in the specialty of elevator/escalator contracting. The Board may establish such
53	requirements for approval of training instructors, the criteria for the continuing education and such other
54	regulations to ensure the protection of the public interest. Such criteria shall include approval of
55 56	curriculum sponsored by national or state professional elevator industry associations approved by the
56	Board.

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
