A BILL to amend and reenact § 2.2-2101 of the Code of Virginia, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 24 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 22, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2462 and 2.2-2463, relating to the creation of the Virginia-Africa Advisory Board.

11 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

12 1. That § 2.2-2101 of the Code of Virginia, as it is currently effective and as it shall become 13 effective, is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in 14 Chapter 24 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 22, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2462 and 15 2.2-2463 as follows:

\$ 2.2-2101. (Effective until July 1, 2008) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards,
 commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions.

Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position.

§ 2.2-2101. (Effective July 1, 2008) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards,
 commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions.

53 Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils 54 within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs 55 established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 56 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the 57 appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the 58 executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 86

59 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another 60 person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position.

87 § 2.2-2462. Virginia-Africa Advisory Board; purpose; membership; terms; compensation and 88 expenses: staff: chairman's executive summary.

89 A. The Virginia-Africa Advisory Board (the Board) is established as an advisory board, within the 90 meaning of § 2.2-2100, in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the Board shall be 91 to advise the Governor on ways to improve economic and cultural links between the Commonwealth and 92 African nations, with a focus on the areas of commerce and trade, art and education, and general 93 government.

94 B. The Board shall consist of 27 members that include 25 citizen members and two ex officio 95 members as follows: six citizen members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, who may 96 be members of the House of Delegates or other state or local elected officials; six citizen members 97 appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules, who may be members of the Senate or other state or local 98 elected officials; 13 members appointed by the Governor who represent business, industry, education, 99 the arts, and government; and the Secretary of Commerce and Trade and the Secretary of Education, or 100 their designees, who shall serve as ex officio voting members of the Board.

101 C. Nonlegislative citizen members appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of four years and nonlegislative citizen members appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules and the Speaker of the 102 House of Delegates shall serve for terms of two years. Legislative members and the Secretaries of 103 Commerce and Trade, and Education, or their designees, shall serve terms coincident with their terms 104 of office. Vacancies occurring other than by expiration of a term shall be filled for the unexpired term. 105 Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. Any member may be 106 107 reappointed for successive terms.

108 D. The members of the Board shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman annually from among its 109 membership. The Board shall meet at such times as it deems appropriate or on call of the chairman. A 110 majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

111 E. Members shall receive no compensation for their services. However, all members shall be 112 reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as 113 provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of the expenses of the members shall be 114 provided by the Office of the Governor. 115

F. The Office of the Governor shall serve as staff to the Board.

116 G. The chairman of the Board shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an annual 117 executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Board no later than the first day of each regular session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall be submitted as provided in the 118 119 procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents 120 and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

121 § 2.2-2463. Powers and duties of the Board.

122 The Board shall have the power and duty to:

123 1. Undertake studies and gather information and data in order to accomplish its purposes as set 124 forth in § 2.2-2462, and to formulate and present its recommendations to the Governor and the General 125 Assembly.

126 2. Apply for, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations from public, quasi-public, or private
127 sources, including any matching funds as may be designated in the appropriation act, to enable it to
128 better carry out its purposes.

129 3. Report annually its findings and recommendations to the Governor. The Board may make interim 130 reports to the Governor as it deems advisable.

131 4. Account annually on its fiscal activities, including any matching funds received or expended by the 132 Board.
