8	accordance with the provisions of House Joint Resolution No. 577, shall proceed this day
9	To the election of Circuit Court judges for a term of eight years commencing as follows:
10	One judge for the Third Judicial Circuit, term commencing July 1, 2007.
11	One judge for the Fourth Judicial Circuit, term commencing July 1, 2007.
12	One judge for the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit, term commencing April 1, 2007.
13	One judge for the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit, term commencing July 1, 2007.
14	To the election of General District Court judges for a term of six years commencing as follows:
15	One judge for the Ninth Judicial District, term commencing July 1, 2007.
16	One judge for the Twenty-fourth Judicial District, term commencing April 1, 2007.
17	To the election of Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court judges for a term of six years
18	commencing as follows:
19	One judge for Judicial District 2-A, term commencing April 1, 2007.
20	One judge for the Fourth Judicial District, term commencing April 1, 2007.
21	One judge for the Sixth Judicial District, term commencing June 1, 2007.
22 23	One judge for the Thirteenth Judicial District, term commencing April 1, 2007.
23 24	One judge for the Twentieth Judicial District, term commencing May 1, 2007.
24 25	And that in the execution of the joint order nominations shall be made in the order herein named
25 26	and that each house shall be notified of said nominations, and when the rolls shall be called for the
26 27	whole number, the presiding officers of each house shall appoint a committee of four, which together shall constitute the joint committee to count the vote of each house in each case and report the results to

their respective houses. The joint order may be suspended by the presiding officer of either house at any time but for no longer than twenty-four hours to receive the report of the joint committee.
