4	Continuing the Joint Subcommittee to Study Medical, Ethical, and Scientific Issues Relating to Stem Cell
5	Research Conducted in the Commonwealth. Report.

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10	WHEREAS, House Joint Resolution No. 588 (2005) established the Joint Subcommittee to Study
11 12	Medical, Ethical, and Scientific Issues Relating to Stem Cell Research Conducted in the Commonwealth; and
13	WHEREAS, House Joint Resolution No. 48 (2006) last continued the study to review new
14	developments in stem cell research and treatment and seek to fulfill its recommendation to establish an
15	umbilical cord blood bank initiative in the Commonwealth; and
16	WHEREAS, House Bill 413 (2006) and Senate Bill 370 (2006) established the Virginia Cord Blood
17	Bank Initiative that charged the State Health Commissioner with developing a collaborative consortium
18 19	to assist in the realization of a cord blood bank in Virginia; and WHEREAS, the joint subcommittee has met four times during the 2006 interim and heard about the
20	Virginia Department of Health's progress in convening a consortium of interested parties; and
21	WHEREAS, according to the Virginia Department of Health there may be various federal grants
22	available to initiatives such as the Virginia Cord Blood Bank Initiative; and
23	WHEREAS, upon seeking input from the Virginia Department of Health, the joint subcommittee was
24 25	told that being able to reference the joint subcommittee on grant applications could be a strong factor in
25 26	obtaining favorable decisions on grant applications; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Subcommittee to
20 27	Study Medical, Ethical, and Scientific Issues Relating to Stem Cell Research Conducted in the
28	Commonwealth be continued. The joint subcommittee shall have a total membership of 15 members that
29	shall consist of five members of the House of Delegates appointed by the Speaker of the House of
30	Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the
31 32	House of Delegates; three members of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; one representative each of the University of Virginia School of Medicine and the Eastern Virginia
32 33	Medical School and two nonlegislative citizen members at-large to be appointed by the Speaker of the
34	House of Delegates; and one representative of the Virginia Commonwealth University School of
35	Medicine and two nonlegislative citizen members at-large to be appointed by the Senate Committee on
36	Rules. Nonlegislative citizen members of the joint subcommittee shall be citizens of the Commonwealth
37	of Virginia. The current members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates shall be subject
38 39	to reappointment. The current members appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules shall continue to serve until replaced. Vacancies shall be filled by the original appointing authority. Unless otherwise
<b>40</b>	approved in writing by the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk, nonlegislative
41	citizen members shall only be reimbursed for travel originating and ending within the Commonwealth of
42	Virginia for the purpose of attending meetings. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is
43	agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required. The joint subcommittee shall elect a
44 45	chairman and vice chairman from among its membership, who shall be members of the General Assembly.
<b>4</b> 6	In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall (i) continue to monitor the progress of the
47	Virginia Cord Blood Bank Initiative, including various ways the bank could be utilized, such as treating
<b>48</b>	first responders to a terrorist attack; and (ii) continue to review new and emerging issues in stem cell
<b>49</b>	research and treatment.
50 51	Administrative staff support shall continue to be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates. Legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee
51 52	shall continue to be provided by the Division of Legislative Services. Technical assistance shall continue
53	to be provided by the Virginia Department of Health. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide
54	assistance to the joint subcommittee for this study, upon request.
55	The joint subcommittee shall be limited to two meetings for the 2007 interim, and the direct costs of
56 57	this study shall not exceed \$5,400 without approval as set out in this resolution. Of this amount an
57 58	estimated \$2,000 is allocated for speakers, materials, and other resources. Approval for unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the chairman of the joint
50	nonnember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the charman of the joint

subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreedto, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required.

61 No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the House members
62 or a majority of the Senate members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the
63 recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the
64 joint subcommittee.

The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2007 and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and recommendations no later than the first day of the 2008 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports

72 and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint
 Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or
 delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2007 interim.
