4	Establishing a joint subcommittee to study the feasibility and desirability of constructing light rail
5	transportation along the existing Washington and Old Dominion Rail Trail. Report.

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10	WHEREAS, the construction of a light rail line along the existing corridor from Shirlington,
11	Virginia, to Purcellville, Virginia, would provide much needed rail transportation in Northern Virginia;
12	and
13	WHEREAS, several rail stations still exist along the rail corridor; and
14 15	WHEREAS, a newly constructed light rail line could coexist with the current recreational use of the rail trail; and
16	WHEREAS, light rail transportation in Northern Virginia would alleviate much of the traffic
17	congestion on the overcrowded highways in the region; and
18	WHEREAS, construction of light rail would aid in the Virginia Department of Transportation's goal
19	of attaining a high level of multimodalism in the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it
20	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That a joint subcommittee be
21	established to study the feasibility and desirability of constructing light rail transportation along the existing Washington and Old Dominion Rail Trail. The joint subcommittee shall have a total
22 23	membership of 11 members comprising eight legislative members, two nonlegislative citizen members,
24	and one ex officio members. Members shall be appointed as follows: five members of the House of
25	Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of
26	proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; three members of the
27	Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; one nonlegislative citizen member
28 29	representing the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority to be appointed by the Speaker of the House
29 30	of Delegates; and one nonlegislative citizen member representing the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules. The Director of the Department of Rail
31	and Public Transportation or his designee shall serve ex officio with voting privileges. Nonlegislative
32	citizen members of the joint subcommittee shall be citizens of the Commonwealth of Virginia. Unless
33	otherwise approved in writing by the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk,
34	nonlegislative citizen members shall only be reimbursed for travel originating and ending within the
35 36	Commonwealth of Virginia for the purpose of attending meetings. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required. The joint
37	subcommittee shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its membership, who shall be
38	members of the General Assembly.
39	In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall study the benefits and cost of the
<b>10</b>	implementation of light rail transportation along the existing rail corridor and how to construct a light
<b>11</b>	rail line without negatively affecting those who use the corridor for recreational purposes.
42 43	Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates. Legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee shall be
<b>1</b> 3 14	provided by the Division of Legislative Services. Technical assistance shall be provided by the
45	Department of Rail and Public Transportation. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide
<b>16</b>	assistance to the joint subcommittee for this study upon request.
<b>17</b>	The joint subcommittee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2007 interim, and the direct costs of
18 10	this study shall not exceed \$8,800 without approval as set out in this resolution. Approval for
49 50	unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the chairman of the joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is
51	agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required.
52	No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the House members
53	or a majority of the Senate members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the
54	recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the
55 56	joint subcommittee.
50	The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2007, and the chairman shall

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56 The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2007, and the chairman shall 57 submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and 58 recommendations no later than the first day of the 2008 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The INTRODUCED

59 executive summary shall state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General 60

Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and the report shall be submitted as provided in the 61 procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents 62

63 and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint 64 65 Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or

66 delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2007 interim.
