10	WHEREAS, 2007 marks the 400th anniversary and celebration of the settling of Jamestown as the
11	first permanent English settlement in the Americas; and
12	WHEREAS, Jamestown represents the establishment of the traditions of representative government,
13	the rule of law, free enterprise, and cultural diversity which form the basis of American culture today;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, the commemoration of Jamestown provides many opportunities for Virginians to renew
16	their commitment to civic engagement; and
17	WHEREAS, Delegates to the First Annual Congressional Conference on Civic Education
18	acknowledged the urgent need to address the low level of civic engagement in America; and
19 20	WHEREAS, only 24 percent of eligible voters ages 18-19 voted in the 2006 mid-term election; and
20 21	WHEREAS, the civic mission of schools is essential to the purpose of education; and WHEREAS, civic education teaches students the tools to maintain our democratic republic; and
21 22	WHEREAS, studies have shown that classroom time devoted to civics instruction has declined
23	throughout the nation; and
23 24	WHEREAS, according to the 1998 civics report card of the National Assessment of Educational
25	Progress, just 25 percent of America's schoolchildren could achieve a proficient score in their knowledge
26 26	of civics and government; now, therefore, be it
27	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly designate
28	the third week of September, in 2007 and in each succeeding year, as Civics Education Week; and, be it
