9	WITEDEAS a college education is acceptial in a knowledge based slabel acception and
10 11	WHEREAS, a college education is essential in a knowledge-based global economy; and WHEREAS, increased knowledge and skills result in enhanced employability, higher earning power,
12	career advancement, and a better quality of life; and
13	WHEREAS, faculty develop and deliver world class educational programs responsive to student
14	needs; and
15	WHEREAS, faculty expertise enables college graduates to become productive, tax-paying employees
16	for thousands of employers across the Commonwealth, region, and nation; and
17 18	WHEREAS, a base budget funding gap of \$350 million has greatly diminished the ability of Virginia's public colleges and universities to effectively respond to an increasingly competitive market
10 19	for quality faculty; and
20	WHEREAS, the Council of University Presidents, legislators, and business leaders across the
21	Commonwealth have expressed concerns regarding the impact of funding gaps and budget reductions on
22	the ability of institutions to recruit and retain high quality faculty; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the State Council of Higher
24 25	Education be requested to study Virginia's competitiveness in attracting and retaining faculty for public institutions of higher education.
<b>2</b> 6	In conducting its study, the State Council of Higher Education shall (i) review, analyze, and compare
27	current salary level data, by academic discipline and rank, of each public institution of higher education
28	with current national salary levels; (ii) review, analyze, and compare data pertaining to current
29	retirement options and benefits, health coverage plans, and other benefits for Virginia faculty with
30	comparable national data; (iii) identify best practices for recruiting and retaining high quality faculty;
31 32	(iv) advise Boards of Visitors, institutional administrative faculty and staff, and the General Assembly regarding the competitiveness of salary levels, retirement benefits, health coverage, and other benefits for
33	Virginia faculty relative to the national norm; and (v) recommend feasible and appropriate alternatives
34	for improving the ability of public institutions of higher education to attract and retain high quality
35	faculty.
36	Technical assistance shall be provided to the State Council of Higher Education by the General
37	Professional Advisory Committee to the State Council of Higher Education and the staffs of the House
38 39	Committee on Appropriations and Senate Committee on Finance. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the State Council of Higher Education for this study, upon request.
<b>40</b>	The State Council of Higher Education shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2007, and shall
41	submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings
42	and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and
43	report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
44	Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2008
45	Regular Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
