Brickhouse Post 400 of the American Legion, board member and chairman of the Eastern Shore Area Agency on Aging/Community Action Agency, and member of the board of Shore Memorial Hospital; and

WHEREAS, always concerned with the well-being of his neighbors, John Worsley was a faithful member of the Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church of Eastville and was active in the church's many missions in the community; and

WHEREAS, after retiring from Northampton County Public Schools, John Worsley spent many happy hours fishing and preparing his favorite dishes for his friends and family, especially his North Carolina Barbecue; and

WHEREAS, John Worsley will be fondly remembered for his dedication to excellence in education and his great support and mentorship of young people; and

WHEREAS, John Worsley will be greatly missed by his wife, two sons and grandson, and numerous other loving family members and friends; now, therefore, be it
