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10	WHEREAS, House Joint Resolution No. 133 (2006) and Senate Joint Resolution No. 94 (2006)
11	established the Joint Subcommittee to Study Long-Term Funding Sources for the Purchase of
12	Development Rights to Preserve Open-Space Land and Farmlands; and
13	WHEREAS, the joint subcommittee met three times in 2006; and
14	WHEREAS, the joint subcommittee learned that the Commonwealth needs to conserve an additional
15	308,451 acres in the Chesapeake Bay watershed by January 1, 2010, to meet one of its objectives under
16	the Chesapeake 2000 Agreement; and
17	WHEREAS, a primary tool in the Commonwealth for land preservation is Virginia's land
18	preservation tax credit; and
19	WHEREAS, a majority of the 308,451 acres more than likely will be preserved through donations by
20	landowners in exchange for land preservation tax credits; and
21	WHEREAS, at this juncture it is unclear how many of the 308,451 acres will have to be preserved
22	through acquisition of development rights by state and local governments and other entities; and
23	WHEREAS, good estimates are not yet available for the average cost per acre to acquire such land;
24	and
25	WHEREAS, continuing the House Joint Resolution No. 133/ Senate Joint Resolution No. 94 study an
26	additional year will assist in obtaining more reliable estimates for these unknown variables; and
27	WHEREAS, there is a need for a coordinated plan for the conservation of land outside of the
28	Chesapeake Bay watershed; and
29	WHEREAS, a cost sharing arrangement between the Commonwealth and its local governments needs
30	to be developed in order to meaningfully preserve Virginia's agricultural and open-space lands; now,
31 32	therefore, be it BESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring. That the Joint Subcommittee to
32 33	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Subcommittee to Study Long-Term Funding Sources for the Purchase of Development Rights to Preserve Open-Space
33 34	Land and Farmlands be continued. The joint subcommittee shall have a total membership of nine
35	members that shall consist of six members of the House of Delegates appointed by the Speaker of the
36	House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the
37	Rules of the House of Delegates, and three members of the Senate appointed by the Senate Committee
38	on Rules. The current members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates shall be subject to
39	reappointment. The current members appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules shall continue to
40	serve until replaced. Vacancies shall be filled by the original appointing authority. The joint
41	subcommittee shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its membership, who shall be
42	members of the General Assembly.
43	In conducting its study, the joint subcommittee shall review recent funding for the preservation of
44	open-space land, the future needs of the Commonwealth for open-space land, the cost of such needs, and
45	long-term funding to pay the costs. In addition, the joint subcommittee shall develop a plan for the
46	sharing of the costs of land preservation among the Commonwealth and its local governments.
47	Administrative staff support shall be provided by the Office of the Clerk of the House of Delegates.
48	Legal, research, policy analysis, and other services as requested by the joint subcommittee shall be
49	provided by the Division of Legislative Services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide
50	assistance to the joint subcommittee for this study, upon request.
51	The joint subcommittee shall be limited to four meetings for the 2007 interim, and the direct costs of
52	this study shall not exceed \$9,000 without approval as set out in this resolution. Approval for
53	unbudgeted nonmember-related expenses shall require the written authorization of the chairman of the
54	joint subcommittee and the respective Clerk. If a companion joint resolution of the other chamber is
55 54	agreed to, written authorization of both Clerks shall be required.
56 57	No recommendation of the joint subcommittee shall be adopted if a majority of the House members
57 58	or a majority of the Senate members appointed to the joint subcommittee (i) vote against the recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the
50	recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to ran notwithistaliding the majority vote of the

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59 joint subcommittee.

60 The joint subcommittee shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2007, and the chairman shall 61 submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and 62 recommendations no later than the first day of the 2008 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The 63 executive summary shall state whether the joint subcommittee intends to submit to the General 64 Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of 65 the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports 66 and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 67

68 Implementation of this resolution is subject to subsequent approval and certification by the Joint 69 Rules Committee. The Committee may approve or disapprove expenditures for this study, extend or

70 delay the period for the conduct of the study, or authorize additional meetings during the 2007 interim.
