WHEREAS, possessing unlimited energy, enthusiasm, and an infectious smile, Karen Hackney was the manager and driving force of the 2006 Vienna Farmers' Market, making it bigger and better than in previous years; and

WHEREAS, Karen Hackney was a founding member and first president of the Vienna Jaycees, a volunteer photographer for the Vienna Senators, and a representative on the Vienna-Tyson's Chamber of Commerce Non-Profit Committee; and

WHEREAS, Karen Hackney will be fondly remembered as a wonderful mother and wife and will be greatly missed by her loving family, her numerous friends, fellow Jaycees, and the customers, vendors, and friends of the market; now, therefore, be it
