071579726 **SENATE BILL NO. 1136** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on General Laws and Technology 4 5 6 on January 31, 2007) (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator McDougle) A BILL to amend and reenact § 2.2-2628 of the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by 7 adding a section numbered 2.2-2629.1, relating to the Council on Indians. 8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 9 1. That § 2.2-2628 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 2.2-2629.1 as follows: 10 11 § 2.2-2628. Council on Indians; membership; terms; chairman; compensation and expenses; chairman's executive summary. 12 A. The Council on Indians (the Council) is established as an advisory council, within the meaning of 13 14 § 2.2-2100, in the executive branch of state government. The Council shall be composed of a total of 18 15 members that shall consist of four legislative members and 14 nonlegislative citizen members as follows: (i) 13 nonlegislative members representing (i) the chiefs of the Virginia tribes officially recognized by 16 17 the Commonwealth, who shall be entitled but not required to be represented by one member from each tribe, and the remaining Indian members chosen at large from the Indian population residing in Virginia, 18 and one member from the Commonwealth at large, all of whom shall be appointed by the Governor; (ii) 19 20 three members of the House of Delegates appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in 21 accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of 22 Delegates; and (iii) one member of the Senate appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules (ii) two members appointed at large by the Governor from the Indian population residing in Virginia, and (iii) 23 24 one nonvoting member appointed by the Governor who is a senior member of his staff. If a recognized 25 tribe elects not to be represented, then that seat on the Council shall remain vacant until such time as the tribe elects to be represented. Each at-large member from the Indian population residing in the 26 27 Commonwealth shall be required, as a condition of his appointment to the Council, to provide 28 verification of his status as an enrolled member of a tribe recognized by either the Commonwealth, 29 another state, or territory. Such verification shall consist of a valid tribal identification card, confirmation 30 of membership through a central tribal registry, a written statement of a tribal chief or council 31 confirming membership, or certification of the enrolled member status from a tribal office. 32 B. After the original appointments, all nonlegislative citizen appointments shall be for terms of three 33 years except appointments to fill vacancies, which shall be for the unexpired terms. Legislative members 34 shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. All members may be reappointed. However, no 35 nonlegislative citizen member shall be eligible to serve more than three successive three-year terms, no 36 member of the Senate shall be eligible to serve more that two successive four-year terms, and no 37 member of the House of Delegates shall be eligible to serve more than four successive two-year terms, 38 provided that no appointments to fill vacancies for an unexpired term shall be included in determining 39 the term limit. Each chief shall serve a term coincident with his term of office as chief and may appoint 40 one designee who may serve as his representative at Council meetings and other Council activities. The 41 senior member of the Governor's staff shall serve a term coincident with the member's term of office. 42 After the original appointments, the appointments of the at large members shall be for terms of two years except appointments to fill vacancies, which shall be for the unexpired terms. At large members 43 44 may be reappointed. However, no at large member shall be eligible to serve more than three successive 45 two-year terms

C. The Governor shall appoint one of the members appointed pursuant to clause (i) or (ii) of 46 47 subsection A as chairman, who shall serve in such position at the pleasure of the Governor. The Council shall elect a vice-chairman from among its membership. The Council shall annually elect a chair and **48** vice-chair from among its membership. The meetings of the Council shall be held at the call of the 49 50 chairman or whenever the majority of the voting members so request. A majority of the nonlegislative 51 members shall constitute a quorum.

D. Members of the Council shall receive no compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed 52 53 for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in 54 §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of expenses of the members shall be provided by the 55 Office of the Governor.

E. The chairman of the Council shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an annual 56 57 executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Council no later than the first day of each regular session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall be submitted as provided in the 58 59 procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents

§ 2.2-2629.1. Advisory Committee. The Council shall establish a non voting advisory committee consisting of representatives of recognized and non-recognized Indian tribes. The advisory committee shall perform duties which may 62 63 64 be assigned by the Council.
